

**SPORTING GOSSIP.**

Miners of Leadville have challenged Macey and Shields of Clear Creek county, Col., to a rock drilling contest for \$500 a side, the contest to take place either in Leadville or Denver. The contest is to be confined to two holes, one a double-handed down hole with turner, and one a dry back hole. The time limit is 15 minutes.
