U. S. AND TERRITORIAL COURTS. The Times for Holding Court in the Several Judicial Districts of the Territory of Montana.

The courts sitting to hear and determine causes arising under the constitution of the United States will be held in the several districts, as follows, to wit:

In the first judicial district, at the city of Helena, on the second Monday in April and the second Monday in October of each year.

In the second judicial district, at the city of Deer Lodge, on the first Monday in April and the first Monday in October of each year.

In the third judicial district, at the city of Bozeman, on the fourth Monday in May and the fourth Monday in November of each year.

In the fourth judicial district, at the city of Great Falls, on the first Monday in June and the first Monday in December of each year.

The territorial courts are held in the several counties as follows, to wit:

In the first judicial district: In the county of Lewis and Clark, on the second Monday in April and the second Monday in October.

In the county of Jefferson, on the first Monday in March and the first Monday in September.

In the county of Beaverhead, on the third Monday in March and the third Monday in September.

In the second judicial district: In the county of Silver Bow, on the first Monday in May and the first Monday in November.

In the county of Deer Lodge, on the first Monday in April and the first Monday in October.

In the county of Missoula, on the second Monday in March and the second Monday in September.

In the third judicial district: In the county of Madison, on the first Monday in March and the first Monday in September.

In the county of Park, on the fourth Monday in March and the fourth Monday in September.

In the county of Custer, on the first Monday in May and the first Monday in November.

In the county of Yellowstone, on the second Monday in April and the second Monday in October.

In the county of Gallatin, on the fourth Monday in May and the fourth Monday in November.

In the fourth judicial district: In the county of Cascade, on the third Monday in March and the third Monday in September.

In the county of Fergus, on the first Monday in April and the first Monday in October.

In the county of Dawson, on the third Monday in April and the third Monday in October.

In the county of Chouteau, on the first Monday in May and the first Monday in November.
