 Pocket books concerned entirely in this silver are cropping up.
 Link cuff buttons devised as distinctive business are an innovation.
 Printed glass link buttons with etched and engraved tops are selling well.
 Braided-silver umbrella handles terminating in heavy knobs are all the go.
 Silver deposits and mother of pearl in the combination used in many cases.
 There is no diminution in the sale of single bracelets, the ladies affecting them as much as ever.
 Another new paper-weight device is an imitation rug, upon which kneels a Turk, evidently in prayer.
 A silver coin looking down with calm severity upon a lead, forms a match-box in this season's batch.
 Clock buckles in various sizes, of the most exquisite pierced work in silver, are a fad among the ladies.
 A rival to the expensive garter clasp is the new silver-and-gold stocking supporter now in the market.
 A novel conception in scarfpins is a gold anvil, in front of which is sunk a perpendicular line of diamonds.
 Opera-glass holders in chased gold and in stained ivory and silver deposit are conspicuous in jewelers' displays.
 A novel form in card receivers is a gilt bronze bears resting upon three darts and containing at one end a tiny cupid.
 Brace-brac novelties include a terra cotta heart with a cupid's hand and shoulder smiling through the center.
 Numbered among the fanciful hairpin devices is a blue tinted moonstone, set in a diamond-shaped frame of rubies.
 Little bronze troughs with members of the feathered tribe perched upon the sides constitute something new in ash trays.
 A hairpin top recently seen took the form of a tiny tree, represented by floss, sparkling with tiny stones scattered all over it.
 The fancy of the hour is a pair of earrings, fashioned as plates in the old-time willow pattern in enamel, with diamond borders.
 A dull gold nail, twisted and retwisted through a diamond and sapphire horse-shoe composes a brooch that is receiving praise.
 Pretty little scarf pins come as filigree gold circles, edged with gold pins driven half way through, forming a railing around.
 A miniature gold drum, with crystal top, ornamental gold wires crowning in every direction comprises a charming queen chain pendant.
