Election Frauds in Arkansas. HELENA, Ark., Dec. 24.—The United States grand jury returned 10 indictments for election frauds alleged to have taken place at the last congressional election in the first district. The county judge of Craighead county is among the number indicted for failure to appoint judges from both political parties as the law provides. These prosecutions will undoubtedly affect the contest now pending in Congress between Cate and Featherstone.

The Dismal Swamp Canal. A syndicate of New York capitalists have purchased the Dismal Swamp canal in Virginia and North Carolina for \$75,000. The new owners intend to rebuild the locks and widen and deepen the canal for vessels of the largest draught and make this route the connecting link from Chesapeake bay with the great inland waterway of the Atlantic coast, as deeper water can be had by the way of Pasquotank river at the end of the canal than by the head of the Curticek sound.

A Three-Legged Steer. Harry Bates, of East Saginaw, Mich., owns a steer which has only three legs, one of its front legs being the absentee. The animal was born that way and moves as readily as anybody's steer.
