NEW YORK, Jan. 3.—Stocks were unusually dull to-day, especially in the forenoon when high rates for money served to restrict trading to the smallest limits, but later there was a remarkable drop in money rates and prices for stocks responded quickly, and although the business done was but little larger than during the forenoon, the most marked advances took place right through the list, the losses of yesterday being recovered with large fractions in addition.
