**Topi of General Interest in the Four New States and Elsewhere.**

**MONTANA.**

Work on Bozeman's new hotel has been commenced.

Livingston has raised over \$2,000 to celebrate Fourth of July.

The people of Livingston are making preparations to entertain the press gang next August.

The output of coal in Red Lodge at the present time is about one hundred and forty car loads per week with the chance of a steady increase.

General Manager Meilen and the engineers and firemen of the Northern Pacific have settled all points satisfactorily; some inequalities have been smoothed and small promotions adjusted. The matter of promotions was fixed so that the oldest men in the service on all divisions will have their choice of positions on their divisions. It was also agreed that no firemen shall be suspended or discharged unless notified in writing of the charge against him and opportunity offered him to put in a defence.

The artesian well at Glendive is down 100 feet with the drill in sand rock. This strata has the appearance of being thin. The contractor expects to complete the job within a month, the time depending altogether on the formations struck in going down. He is confident of striking water within the 500 foot limit. A record is being kept of the different strata passed through in boring the well. This will be very useful, as one of the troubles of the government engineers in forming conclusions from their examinations of the wells in Dakota was a lack of this knowledge.

The Billings Gazette says Plenticoues, a leading chief of the Crows, and a retinue consisting of a dozen lesser lights of the Crow nation, is on a visit to the Nez Perce agency in Idaho. They expect to institute inquiry concerning the coming of the humbug Christ, as well as a change of grub. The old chief telegraphed ahead to Genessee, Idaho, to have the agent send horses to the station to meet his party and escort them in state to the agency. Plenticoues carries his gait with him wherever he goes, notwithstanding its colossal proportions.

**WASHINGTON.**

Indian skulls and bones are being found in profusion along Hangman creek, Spokane county, since the high water.

Richard Anderson, sentenced to hang at Ellensburg this month, has been granted a reprieve to July 25, in order to give time for an appeal to the supreme court.

The Hotel Spokane has imported twenty colored waiters from Chicago, because of frequent complaints from their guests that the white waiters were insolent.

A friend at Puyallup informs us that hop vines in that neighborhood recently grew 13 inches in 14 hours, or nearly an inch an hour. That is the most astonishing growth of which we have ever heard, and if true certainly beats the record.—*Slaughter Sun.*

The seventh annual reunion of the Washington Pioneer association will be held at Seattle on July 3 and 4, 1890, on which occasion the pioneers will be entertained by the people of Seattle, with their usual hospitality, according to a programme to be prepared by themselves.

Lattin, the murderer of C. C. Grant at Tacoma, has quit playing sick and trying to escape from the penitentiary, and is now doing the state some service making brick. By his attempts to escape he has forfeited his chances for commutation of five and a half years, under the law, and will have to serve his full time, twenty years.

Money is loaned at 1 1/2 per cent by the banks in Ellensburg and none is now to be had at that. There seems to be a scarcity all through the interior of the state. Last year, in the months of May and June, money was plenty, and the rate from 9 to 15 per cent per year, out the great demand for capital, caused by the rapid growth of cities and the necessity for replacing many cities destroyed in the great conflagration in three of the principal cities, has brought about the present general stringency.

While Representative Randall of Stevens county was in Spokane Falls a few days ago, he was consulted with reference to the opportunity of establishing a paper mill at Kettle Falls, and he expressed the opinion that all the requisite material existed in that vicinity, while the falls afford cheap water power for the operation of machinery that cannot be excelled, save perhaps in the city of Spokane Falls. The same conditions exist at Post Falls, where there is an abundance of the very best wood for the manufacture of pulp.

**THE TWO DAKOTAS.**

The annual conference of the South Dakota Methodists will be held at Mitchell October 6.

A Sioux squaw secured a divorce from her husband at Pierre the other day on the ground of desertion.

Washington Hughes of Spearfish is held in bonds of \$500 to appear for trial at Deadwood on the charge of killing a horse by heating it with a club.

The Olivet Herald says a party of Iowa hunters are making a trip through that part of the state after wolf scalps, which they intend to place on the Iowa market where the bounty is much larger than it is in Dakota.

The new Methodist college at Hot Springs will be opened, it is expected, on September 11, with a full corps of instructors. The trustees will meet at Hot Springs on the 27th inst, for the purpose of electing a faculty.

The Fargo fire department, board of trade, mayor and city council are sending out invitations to the grand tournaments of the North Dakota firemen, band, baseball and wheelmen, to be held in that city June 27 to 30 inclusive.

Two judges, Haney of North Dakota, and Aiken, of South Dakota, have decided that there is no law in either state to punish adultery, the old territorial statute being repealed by a law of congress intended for Utah polygamy, but applicable to all the territories.

While excavating for a lime kiln at Forest City the other day the skeleton of

an Indian was unearthed. There were several holes in the bones, as if made by bullets, and appearances indicate that the brave had met his death violently, probably from a Winchester in the hands of a soldier.

Captain F. S. Demers, receiver at the United States land office at Fargo, has been taken to the Jamestown insane asylum for treatment. The strange actions of Mr. Demers were first noticed while attending the theater at Fargo the other night, and he was taken home by his friends.

**Dixey and the Handcuffs.**

Adonix Dixey, Colonel Miles and Richard Carroll visited the police headquarters to test on a wager of wine Mr. Dixey's reputation for being able to release himself in a trice from any handcuffs known to mechanical skill, says the Cincinnati *Commercial-Gazette*. Col. Phil Deutsch, the famous captain of Cincinnati's finest, was not in his office, but Chief of Detectives Larry Hazen, the gray-haired "Black Duke," was, and politely undertook to secure the comedian in handcuffs that he'd have trouble in changing. "Crime and Misery" reporters, detectives and others gathered around, and intense interest was felt in the result.

Famous criminals there had been, according to Colonel Hazen, whose hands were so small and bones thereof so pliable that they could slip out of almost any handcuffs, but that Dixey, with his large, well-shaped hands, could get out of the "standard" pair the veteran detective proceeded to lock closely upon him—"as close as we ever put them," he said—Colonel Hazen did not believe. When he was pronounced secure, Dixey stepped into a telephone box, and while his back could be seen through the glass door took off the handcuffs, and within a minute and a half came out dangling them triumphantly on his forefinger. Red marks on his wrists showed how closely the steel had clasped the white flesh.

"It is only a trick," said Dixey; but "still the wonder grew" among the detectives.
