

IDAHO STILL WAITING

Republicans Who are Willing to Wait a While for Statehood.

They Want a Dead Sure Thing on the Senatorship Before Idaho Gets in—Some Points in Current Political Gossip.

BLACKFOOT, Idaho, May 31.—The delay in the senate of the bill for the admission of Idaho is causing considerable comment in political circles. Various reasons are given for the apparent lack of interest on the part of the republican senators.

COURT BEING IN SESSION at this place necessarily brings a large number of people from the half-dozen counties in South-eastern Idaho, and it is naturally the place to hold conferences, perfect plans, and talk politics generally; but with the exception of the first few days, politics are seldom mentioned. Of course this may be attributable to the defection among the republicans throughout the territory everywhere.

THE NEW PARTY has quite a following, composed principally of men who are antagonistic to Mr. Dubois for one reason or another. As the STANDARD'S correspondent predicted, the old anti-Mormon cry has been resurrected. In this week's Eagle Rock Register appears a call for June 9 of the anti-Mormon central committee of Bingham county.

THIS WILL BE A big disappointment to some, but it will fall like a benediction upon the substantial men of both parties; men who are not candidates for offices at every election, but have fought the Mormon church from principle. Now that they have succeeded in routing the enemy they are willing to drop the question and devote their time to something else.

CHIEF JUSTICE BEATTY dropped in on us a few days ago, ostensibly to pay a visit to his colleague, Judge Berry. Rumor has it, however, that he came over to have a conference with some of the members of the new party, and perhaps find out if all the good places had been mortgaged.

An editorial appeared in the Salt Lake Tribune some time ago, criticizing the water decisions of Judge Berry. Berry thought the article had been inspired by some of the attorneys who had lost cases in Cassia county recently, and he came back at them vigorously, intimating that the article was inspired by a certain attorney who was a candidate for judge in the prospective state; and that he was adopting such tactics in order to attain political fame.
