

MONTANA AND THE FAIR

Meeting of the State Board of Managers at Helena.

AN INTERESTING ADDRESS

Executive Commissioner Bickford Makes His Report - Plans for Buildings Presented - Some of the Projects.

HELENA, Nov. 2.—The board of world's fair managers met here to-day at 2 p. m. The first order of business was the report of the executive commissioner, Philip Lovell, Bickford.

Presenting his report, Mr. Bickford referred to the work already performed in behalf of the state commissioners. Regarding the site for the fair building, he said: "I found that application had been made for a piece of ground near the north end of Jackson park on the lake front, and near a pier erected to accommodate visitors arriving by boat from the city."

While in Chicago, another matter was brought to the attention of the director general, and that was a plan for a mountain in miniature, to contain a mine in full operation. The sketch for this was made at the instance of J. J. Palmer, and the suggestions contained in the picture, and urged by Mr. Palmer have merit.

The other mineral exhibits could be grouped around in an artistic and effective manner, and in such a way as to attract the most attention the most comprehensive conception of our mineral output.

The Newkirk collection of minerals, owned by Butte, is also said to be one of the finest collections of specimens to be obtained in the west, and arrangements should be made to have this collection added to the mineral display made by Montana.

Among other business transacted was the reading of the report of the secretary, and the reception and filing of various propositions. Among these was one from John Gilman, asking the endorsement of the board for his United States fair exhibition; also, one from a scenic artist, Clausen, in relation to his panorama, to consist of Montana scenes to be displayed at the fair.

The following architectural firms presented plans for the Montana building at the world's fair: Wallace & Thornburg, Paulsen & Lavelle, two sets; N. J. McConnell, J. L. Ladriere, Galbraith & Fuller of Missoula, and O'Meyer & Thori of St. Paul.
