DILLON, April 9. - Edwin Norris, one of our young and promising attorneys, departed Friday morning for his former home, Bowling Green, Ky., where he will lead to the altar Miss Bettie June Wilkins, one of the most charming belles of the Blue Grass state.

A. F. Wright and H. F. Jackson, two of Bannack's leading business men, were in town this week on business.
