THEY TOOK ALL IN SIGHT

Not Even a Township Office Left for the Democrats.

GREAT ALLAH THIS IS TOUGH

The Republicans Came Within an Aes of Making a Clean Sweep in the County of Silver Bow.

BUTTE, Nov. 16.—The official figures on the election returns were completed today, and they show that not even a township office was secured by the democrats, though two fusion candidates for justices of the peace, Kirkwood in Meaderville and Finch in South Butte, succeeded in getting in. Everything else, except two or three township offices, was grabbed by the republicans. The following are the total votes of the different candidates, in addition to those published this morning:

CHICAGO, Nov. 16.—President Debs and Secretary Kellogg of the American Railway union appeared before Judge Grosscup in the United States district court today to plead to the indictments against them for conspiracy in connection with the great railway strike. Owing to the absence of Judge Woods, the case was continued to Dec. 4, when the arguments of the defense to quash the indictments will be heard. Should the motion to quash the indictments be overruled, one of the defendants, probably Debs, would be selected for trial on Jan. 3.
