Certificate of Nomination of the A. P. A. Ticket Not Yet Filed.

MR. JOHNSON IS EXCITED

There Must Be a Distinction in Title When Two Tickets Are Presented for Filing—To-Morrow Will Decide.

BUTTE, April 2.—A committee consisting of C. Q. Johnson, W. O. Clymo and Thomas Richard made an effort to file the certificate of nomination of the A. P. A. ticket with the city clerk this afternoon, which was temporarily unsuccessful.

When it became a certainty that there would be two republican tickets in the field the clerk sought advice from the city attorney in regard to the wording of the certificate of the straight republican party.

Mr. Cotter explained that it was as much to the interest of the A. P. A. republicans as anyone else that there should be no flaw in the election.

Mr. Cotter left the committee a moment later with considerable show of annoyance, after informing Mr. Johnson rather warily that he could neither build a dozen or bully him.


WASHINGTON, April 2.—The president has pardoned John Hopkins, sentenced in Utah to three months in jail and \$300 fine for unlawful cohabitation.
