THEIR LOSING GAME

The Centerville Lodge of the A. P. A. Throws Up Its Charter.

GLITTERING HOPES VANISH

After Electing Their Ticket, Reward Comes in the Nature of a Frosty Snub-Lucky Deal of the Canadians.

The Centerville lodge of the A. P. A. threw up its charter last week. This incident in the disintegration of the A. P. A. indicates more conclusively than anything else the general dissatisfaction at the unfair distribution of the patriotic offices.

Had the native-born Americans been given a fair proportion of the patriotic spoils the Cornish would not have complained so much. But the Americans were not given an even share of more office just to take the curse off, but as a general thing the Canadians grabbed the works.

It is perhaps worthy of note at this time that of the last five mayors Butte has had three have been natives of Canada. If the Canadians were the majority they would not be so surprised; but as a matter of fact they are not so numerous as either the native Americans or the Cornish.

Of the 914 Canadians from 600 to 700, it is estimated, are green and from 200 to 300 are orange. The green includes the Irish-Canadians and the French-Canadians, the balance being reckoned as orange.

During the past five years each of the factions of Canadians has had a mayor, which means that the Canadians are always well represented on the police force and in the offices generally.

These are things which both the Cornish and the native-Americans are just beginning to see. It will be noticed by the above table that the voters born in the United States constitute close to one-half of the total vote of Silver Bow county.
