COUNTY SEAT NOTES

New Cases to Be Heard in Halls of Justice.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE COURT

A Delightful Concert at the Presbyterian Church—Zosel Did Not Get a Post Office—Newspersonals.

Special Correspondence of the Standard. Deer Lodge, May 9.—County Attorney W. H. Trippet filed an information today against Martin Cooney charging him with forgery. The information specifies that the said Martin Cooney on the 20th day of January, 1896, did then and there unlawfully make and forge an order for the payment of money, which order was in substance as follows: "Anaconda, January 20-96. J. M. Kennedy, Justice of the Peace. Please pay money due on judgment in case of myself vs. Dunlevy, to Mr. Cooney, who is my attorney's (J. H. Duffy) clerk. Geo. Mills. That the said order was forged with the intent on the part of Cooney to defraud one James M. Kennedy, being the person mentioned in said order as J. M. Kennedy and to whom said order was addressed.

The defendant on his preliminary examination was bound over to the district court, to answer to the charge, and was released on furnishing bail in the sum of \$500. The defense is made that Cooney was acting as agent for Lawyer Duffy in the case. The defendant appeared in court this morning, and was represented by his counsel, J. H. Duffy. He waived the statutory time to plead and entered a plea of not guilty. His case will not go to trial before the next term of court.

The Anaconda Meat company, through their attorney, J. R. Boardman, commenced an action today in the district court against Gilbert Poirier and Mrs. Gilbert Poirier, who keep a boarding house in the city of Anaconda. The action is brought to recover of the defendants the sum of \$135.15, a balance alleged to be due and unpaid. An attachment was issued.

The district court was in session this morning for a short time and disposed of several cases. In the suit of George Powers vs. Charles Koble, the defendant was granted to and including June 4, 1896, in which to prepare and serve statement on motion for a new trial, and execution ordered stayed upon the defendant filing a bond in double the amount of the judgment and costs, the bond to be filed within five days.

In the suits of Charles Isaacs, J. A. McMaster and William Woodcock against C. H. Brown, W. H. Hineman and H. H. Brown, wherein a default was entered last Monday in favor of the plaintiffs, the court ordered a stay of execution until April 18, 1896.

In the case of John Askman against the Mammoth Gold Mining company, by consent, Counsel Edward Scharnikow, was entered for the plaintiff, John Askman.

The case of Hugh Murphy against the Mammoth Gold Mining company, for the foreclosure of a lien on the defendant's property, which was to have been heard to-day, was continued until May 13, 1896, at 10 o'clock a. m.

The case of Charles B. Taylor, administrator, against James Montgomery, was set for trial on May 13, 1896, at 10 o'clock a. m.

A concert was given at the Presbyterian church this evening in which Albert Wright, professor of violin instruction in the Bozeman Agricultural college, took the leading part. The audience pronounced him an artist. There was also some beautiful singing by a quartet composed of Messrs. Wolfe, Schornikow, Eldred and McLeod. A solo was sung by Mrs. J. H. Mills in her usual superb manner. A handsome sum was netted the church as the result of the successful entertainment.

L. I. Blood, the lumber merchant of Avon, was in Deer Lodge to-day on business connected with his interests.

Charles E. Sackett, the court stenographer, returned from Anaconda this morning.

Judge Brantly returned from Phillipsburg last evening, having completed all the business before the district court of Granite county for this term. Clerk and Recorder John B. Fisher visited Elliston last Thursday on official business.

Rev. Father De Ryckere is able to attend to his ministerial duties again after being confined to the house for several days with rheumatism.

The efforts of the people of Zosel to get a post office established in their thriving camp did not meet with success.


