Sunk in a Squall. Amesburyport, Mass., Sept. 18.-The sloop yacht Emily was struck and sunk by a squall in the narrow strait between and of five men on board two, Adolphus Cole, aged 26, and Gustave Morrean, aged 30, both of Amesbury, were drowned.

With Military Honors. Zanesville, O., Sept. 18.-Surgeon-Major E. C. Farquhar of the 8th Ohio regiment, was buried this afternoon with military honors.

Four Dead Soldiers. Burlington, Vt., Sept. 18.-There have been four deaths in the 1st Vermont regiment of volunteers within the past 24 hours.

Ceded Commercially. Berlin, Sept. 18.-The Vossische Zeitung declares that under the Anglo-German agreement Delagoa Bay was ceded to Great Britain commercially and not politically.

Did Much Damage. Montreal, Sept. 18.-A severe wind and hail storm passed over this city doing much damage.

At Their New Post. Cincinnati, Sept. 18.-The 12th United States infantry arrived here to-day and took a train for Jefferson Barracks, near St. Louis.

Against Anarchists. Rome, Sept. 18.-The government has proposed to the powers that immediate action be taken against anarchists.


