### HIS LAST RIDE.

A Traveling Willie Meets His Fate After Many Years of Sojourning.

As the freight train was pulling out of Chester at 7:00 o'clock Monday evening, Geo. Dennis, alias Daily, an "old timer," attempted to board a box car. Missing his hold, which had always stood him in good stead in the past, he fell beneath the wheels and both legs were crushed just above the knees. He was picked up and taken to Cut Bank, but failing to find medical attention there was brought to Havre Tuesday morning and taken to the St. Paul hotel, where Drs. Almas and MacKenzie amputated the limbs. He had become so weak from the loss of blood that he did not survive the operation and died without regaining consciousness.

The deceased had been around Havre on several occasions, and was a noted character in the police court, having been arrested here for several minor offenses. He had lost an arm prior to the last accident in almost the same manner he lost his legs. He gave his name in police court a few weeks ago as Geo. Dennis, aged 30 years, but it is doubtful if this is his correct name.

A jury was empaneled by Coroner Pyper, consisting of O. G. Skylestead, G. T. Sanderson, R. X. Lewis, Thos. McKenzie, A. C. Lender and G. R. Gentry, who viewed the remains and returned a verdict this morning that deceased came to his death by accidentally falling from a moving train while trespassing on the Great Northern railway.

The remains were made ready for burial by Undertaker Lemmer.

## UNION DELEGATES MEET.

Prepare to Celebrate Labor Day—Havre Herald Was Made Official Paper.

The Trades and Labor Assembly met Tuesday evening and were represented by delegates from ten different unions.

Preparatory committees for a grand celebration on Labor Day were appointed by President Purcell as follows: C. H. Spangler, Louis Lindberg, Wm. Hanks, Al. G. Gray, Adam Hadalin, Chas. Lawson, Geo. Fitzgerald, Norman Jackson and Ed. Odegard. This committee will act in conjunction with the officers of the Trades and Labor Assembly to formulate the preliminary work.

On motion THE HAVRE HERALD was made the official paper of the trades unions and authorized to use the union label in its columns.

### POLICE COURT.

Marshal Webb, of the Great Northern police department, had a brakenman named Harry Peasley arrested on Tuesday for offering to carry passengers from Havre to Spokane on the Great Northern for \$4 each. He was brought before Judge McIntyre last night, the specific charge being that of having obtained money under false pretense. J. L. Gibson, of Dayton, Wash., who was held here as a witness, being one of the eight whom Peasley is charged with defrauding of \$3.00, testified that Peasley met him in the Concert Hall and agreed to take a party of eight to Spokane for \$4 each. On the strength of this Gibson advanced Peasley \$3.00. Marshal Francis and Inspector Boyd testified to having seen the men coming out of the baggage car at the time of Peasley's arrest. Peasley plead not guilty and the case was taken under advisement until this morning. Attorney F. A. Carnal represented the state and Attorney J. K. Bramble the defendant.

Wm. Daniels was arrested and taken before Police Magistrate W. B. Pyper Tuesday, on complaint of M. J. Webb, charging the defendant with petit larceny. The complaint alleged that the defendant stole some ice from the Great Northern ice house. F. A. Carnal appeared as counsel on behalf of the state, and Att'y J. K. Bramble for the defendant. The case was taken under advisement by the magistrate, who announced his decision on Wednesday, dismissing the defendant and assessing the costs to the complaining witness.

### Lee vs. Clifford.

Arrangements have been completed for the 20-round boxing contest between "Kid" Lee, of Havre, and Jack Clifford, of Butte. The fight will take place at the Grand opera house at Great Falls, on July 29th.

Clifford claims the light weight championship of the state of Montana, and Lee claims the same title. The match will therefore be for the purpose of settling the dispute as to the right to the title, and should be one of the most interesting fights that has been pulled off in Great Falls for many months. Both men will enter the ring at 135 pounds, and will fight under straight Queensbury rules.
