NORTH MONTANA PRESS ASSOCIATION.

The newspaper men of northern Montana met in Malta Saturday, for the purpose of forming an organization for mutual pleasure and profit. The visitors represented every locality in the counties of Chouteau and Valley in which a newspaper is published and upon their arrival at Malta were welcomed by John Survant, R. M. Trafton and Dr. Clay, who constituted the reception committee. During their stay in Malta the newspaper men were the guests of the Commercial club, and were royally entertained by the members of that institution.

A business meeting was held by the visitors Saturday afternoon, at which the necessary steps were taken to form a permanent organization. After adopting resolutions the following were elected as the first officers of what will be known as the North Montana Press Association: President, W. K. Harber, of Fort Benton; vice-president, W. C. Kester, of Chinook; secretary-treasurer, J. F. Harris, of Hinsdale. Executive committee: J. J. Amcott, of Glasgow; F. S. Reed, of Culbertson; John Survant, of Malta.

It was decided that the annual meeting of the association shall be held during the last meeting in August, and Chinook was decided as the meeting place for next year. Membership in the association is confined to editors and proprietors of newspapers, or those actively engaged in Northern Montana, and the association starts with a membership of sixteen with several applications pending.

The newspaper men were entertained with a banquet at the Malta House Saturday night, in which a large number of Malta citizens participated, and which closed a day of enjoyment for all who took part in the proceedings.

SHEEPHERDER SUICIDES.

Coroner W. B. Pyper returned Monday from Wagner, Mont., a section house station on the Great Northern railroad, Sixty miles east of Havre, where he held an inquest on the body of Shepherder Jonathan Trask, who was in the employ of Wilson & Cunningham, woolgrowers. Trask committed suicide on Wilson's ranch, twenty miles south of Wagner, by shooting himself in the head with a Winchester rifle. He had been dead three days when found, and his faithful dog was by his side, licking his face and hands. He had no money or relatives. He was a Grand Army man.

A few days before he killed himself he had cashed a check for \$60 and had indulged in a spree.
