


# BIG SHOW COMING TO TOWN

## ATTEMPT TO BREAK JAIL

Fort Benton, Montana, July 7, '08.  
To Havre Herald:—

Julius Ekkrath, a prisoner in the county jail brought from Dodson a few days ago and who is alleged to be insane tried to get away from the authorities on Monday morning. He pushed past the under sheriff while getting his breakfast and made a break for the door and street which he gained. Under Sheriff George Wackerlin and Deputy Sheriff Flanagan started in pursuit and captured their man after a chase of several blocks and after a number of shots had been fired at Ekkrath. He put up a fight and both the officers were cut and bruised about the face and head before he could be overpowered. The prisoner received light wound in one leg from one of the bullets and was slightly bruised about the head while being recaptured. He was returned to the jail and placed in a private cell.

A contract was let to O. E. Peppard of Missoula for repairing the county

bridge here. The repair work is to be of steel and wood and will cost the county \$5,495.00.

Mrs. Mike Healy and Mrs. Olson of Havre were in town Saturday to attend the funeral of Mrs. M. Finnegan who died in California early in the winter and who was brought here for burial by the side of her husband.

The cable came for the ferry that was recently built here for heavy traffic across the Missouri river until the county bridge is repaired, and was put in place Sunday and started running across the river Monday morning.

Friday evening a most enjoyable dance was attended by a large crowd from town and surrounding country at the new opera house. A six piece orchestra furnished the music and all report it as being quite the event of the season.

There are at present 44 inmates in the county jail, the majority of them being hoboes who have drifted into town during the past week and who are causing considerable uneasiness. They are either put to work on the streets or are given a limited time to get out of town.

Owing to the recent flood no preparations were made for a celebration of the Fourth, consequently a very quiet day was the result. A number of the young people enjoyed a picnic on the Teton and in the evening the Misses Nell and Mary Harris entertained a few of their friends at a lawn party at their home of their parents on Hill street.

The steamer O. K., owned by Capt. U. H. Stevens, was burned and completely ruined by the fire a few evenings ago. It is not known how the fire started but it is thought it was possibly done by a bunch of tramps who had been put off several times. The boat was in dry dock awaiting repairs and as soon as they were finished was to make several trips down the Missouri with supplies for the ranchers and bring back coal. The insurance covered about half the value of the boat.

All proposals must be made upon the forms furnished by the City Engineer.

The work contemplated will consist (approximately) of the following:

- 1 cu. yd. solid rock excavation.
- 1 cu. yd. soft rock excavation.
- 528 cu. yds. earth excavation and re-fill.
- 1,200 ft. 6 inch standard cast iron pipe.
- 4 hydrants (Ludlow pattern) two 2 1/2 inch hose nozzles.
- 4 6-inch by 12 feet connecting pipes from main to hydrant.
- 2 6-inch gate valves (Ludlow pattern) hub ends.
- 2 valve boxes.
- 1,000 lbs. special castings.
- 500 feet B. M. lumber
