These Musselshell Bridges. P. M. Gallagher, who was sent by the Commissioners of Yellowstone county to make a report on the Musselshell bridges, has completed his labors.

report it will require a span of 150 feet at both crossings. He says: "At Read's crossing I find that it will require a span of 150 feet to bridge the stream. I have located the proper position for such a bridge, and find that the location is a good one, and that no difficulty need be experienced in building a bridge at this point which will stand any kind of a flood that is likely to occur, provided it is composed of a single span without any obstruction to the current in the shape of piers, and high enough to insure sufficient room for the passage of logs, trees, etc., at high water, and that the abutments be sunk to bed rock and well built. Any other kind of a bridge I should consider unsafe."

From the River Press. Mr. William Harman, who was in the early fall in the employ of the water works company, returned to-day from the Judith Basin and reports everything and everybody in that country taking the winter easy and doing well.

There are quite a large lot of broken beer bottles being hauled out to-day from the different saloons and dumped upon the ice in the middle of the river, and as each bottle probably contains what is known among beer drinkers as a "head-top," we predict a terrible drunk for the suckers when the river breaks up.

Mr. George and Sullivan Wardman, both residents of Wolf creek in the Judith Basin, are in town today purchasing supplies and attending to other business. From these gentlemen we understand that the ice on Arrow creek has broken up and gone out, and that on or about the 21st of January the creek was said by Mr. John Steed, who lives close by, to have been higher than he has ever known it to be, caused from the melting snow and ice.

A communication from O. L. Clement, J. P. for Flat Willow township, states that on the night of the 6th inst. T. D. Clark brought word to Lawrence's that a hunter named Frank had discovered the remains of a man at the "C K" ranch, about 20 miles below the stage crossing.

An inquisition held at the "C K" ranch (so called), in Flat Willow township, in the county of Fergus, Territory of Montana, commenced on the seventh day of February and concluded on the eighth day of said month, A. D. 1888, before me, Olin L. Clement, Justice of the Peace (acting as coroner) in said county, upon the body of a person unknown, there lying dead, by the jurors whose names are hereto subscribed, the said jurors, upon their oaths, do say that he made a careful and exhaustive examination as it was possible under the circumstances.

The body of the deceased, when shown to us was lying upon his back in a cabin on the "C K" ranch, so called, on Flat Willow creek, in Fergus county, Montana. The exact position of the body when discovered will be found in the testimony of Jackson Trunk, the only witness who appeared before us, and the person who discovered the body, and whose testimony accompanies this verdict.

The description of the corpse is as follows: It was that of a man five feet six or seven inches tall, weighing about 140 pounds; dark hair, and heavy brown mustache; features regular; high, round forehead; from 25 to 30 years of age; no scars or evidence of violence discernible upon the body; was dressed in heavy red woolen underwear, blue flannel overshirt and blue overalls. His feet had been terribly frozen and were tied up in some old clothes. His hands had been badly frozen and burnt.

Nothing was found about the premises by which he could be identified. Two dollars and twenty-five cents in silver were found in his pocket. A gray cotton and wool six point double blanket with narrow red, black and yellow stripes was found, partially buried, in the cabin close by him. A large hole had been burned through both shirts in the back, and the right sleeve was burned in several places and his right arm blistered in those places. And that the deceased came to his death by exposure to the elements and freezing.

On the 6th day of February, for Flat Willow P. O. I struck Flat Willow creek near the "C K" ranch, where I found the main building burned and in front of south of where said building stood, at about 20 feet, lay the body of the man now lying before me. The corpse lay on its face, frozen to the ice and snow. As the wolves had tracked all around, I dragged the body into the cook house to protect it from wild animals, and I left it exactly as I found it and as you see it now. I left the next morning for Lawrence's and from there sent word to you.

Chicken foragers have been reported in this vicinity, just as the fowls are beginning to lay, too. The egg market has been more plentifully supplied during the past week and prices are, consequently, going down.

An unknown man came to the post hospital a few days since having one member badly frozen; before he could be attended, however, he escaped—or took a "French" leave, rather. Nobody knows from where the mysterious stranger came or whether he went.

A Pleasant Evening. On the 9th inst. Col. and Mrs. Smith entertained their friends of the post and vicinity. Mrs. Smith, who is always a charming hostess, possessing that rare gift of devoting herself to every one present, had arranged at one end of the drawing room a lovely miniature stage which was occupied during the evening by those who had been invited to contribute to the literary and musical programme which all were delighted.

Obituary. From "L. C." we received the following obituary notice of Mr. Robert Murray, whose death occurred near Philbrook, Feb. 7th, as was chronicled by the Area's last week: "Mr. Robert Murray was a native of Scotland, born May 7th, 1829. Emigrated to the United States in 1869 and came to Montana in '83. Owing to his affliction, (asthma) he was confined closely at home, but all who knew him found him a pleasant, agreeable and Christian gentleman. Deceased was a consistent member of the Presbyterian church, and if a pure walk and a blameless life are any indications, his death is only a happy change to a glorious immortality. The funeral services were held at the schoolhouse in Philbrook, by the Rev. Deacon of the M. E. church, of which he was a member. After a very impressive sermon, the remains were taken to the cemetery and interred. The committal service and their respects for the dead, by a very large attendance—the largest gathering, perhaps, that ever met in Philbrook. The deceased leaves a son and daughter to mourn his loss to whom we tender our deepest sympathies."
