For the past few years the three states (they call them all states now) have maintained a joint stockinspecting bureau. The arrangements have benefited the stockmen by keeping the stock free from disease. Neither Montana or Wyooning had any Texasiever, and during the past twelve months between 120,000 and 130,000 head of cattle from Texas were inspected, and a majority of them came to Montana. It is not the same now as in daysgone by. With the present railroad facilities cattle may be shipped from the fever districts of Texas and be turned loose upon our ranges within a week, and it is only by a system of close inspection that the advent of contagions diseases was prevented.

The action of the government in compelling the removal of all cattle from the Cherokee strip will caussconsiderable loss, and the cattle will be brought to Colorado.
