Local wool growers are arranging to have regular sales days in the Fort Benton market, as soon as a sufficient amount of wool is on hand for that purpose. The first sales day of the series may be held next Saturday.—River Press.

The inconvenience of not having a direct mail and stage line to Billings is already felt. Several passengers have been stranded at Lavina, not knowing of the new regulations. This great region needs a southeastern mail route, and it should be established at once.

Mr. Brown will leave in a few days for California, where he will probably make his future home. He has been a resident of Fergus county thirteen years and has made many friends who will regret his departure. May fortune favor him wherever he casts his lot.

Lieut. Col. John M. Hamilton of the 9th Cav., killed at Santiago, was a Lieut. and afterwards a captain of a company of what was known as the Montana Battalion of the 2nd Cav. Lieut. Col. Patterson, 22nd Infantry, wounded, was at one time in command of Fort Maginnis. Capt. Brett, wounded, was at one time stationed at Maginnis. He is a brother-in-law of Lieut. Col. R. Bruce Wallace of the First Montana, and of Wm. Wallace, of Helena, whose sister he married.

On the 1st inst. the new contractors on the Falls and Lewistown stage line took charge of the route. The schedule of time has been shortened and we are now served with mail every day in the week, changes that ought to insure better mail service than we have been getting for years past. It was reported last week that the new contractors were going to make an effort to have the time schedule lengthened out five hours, a change that the department should not make. If the new contractors will properly equip the line they will have no trouble in making the distance in the time specified in the contract, 25 hours, even under very unfavorable conditions.

Shipp was an able officer of much promise, and commanded the respect and confidence of all who knew him. It is to be hoped that Lieut. Barnum's injuries are not serious.

### BIRTHDAY OF POCKETBOOK.

This Indispensable Article is still Comparatively an Infant in Point of Age.

The organ of the German leather trade, Der Ledermarkt, regrets that last year was not duly observed as the "jubilee of the modern pocket leather purse." The older folk among us will remember some of the predecessors of the "portemonnaie." The most popular of these was a knitted tube or pipe, closed at each end, with an opening on one side, and provided with two metal slip rings.

The neat and handy portemonnaie was the invention of a German book-binder's apprentice in America, Karl Heue, by name, and his novel purse first came into the market in the year 1847. The inventor neglected to patent his new leather portemonnaie with a steel clasp, and it was quickly imitated all over the world; otherwise Heue would probably have become a very rich man. Since that date the portemonnaie has undergone a series of evolutions in form, material and completeness, but the young Heue, according to the Ledermarkt, provided the germ out of which all our modern pocket purses have been developed.
