Judge Pomeroy is an independent candidate for judge of this district. His candidacy is an insult to the republicans of the district and an outrage on the republican county ticket. The county is being flooded with statements that are barefaced falsehoods. That are insults to the intelligence and honor of the people of the county and to the community in which he lives. Mr. Pomeroy is passing before the people of the district as a martyr, who was beaten for a nomination by trickery and fraud. He was forced upon the people of this district against their determined opposition, and when they refused to give him a nomination he adopts the sympathy dodge and cries that he was unfairly beaten. It is told all over the district that he was defrauded out of the delegation in Kalispell. The facts in the case are all that are necessary to brand that statement as false. Of 166 votes in the primaries in precinct number one Mr. Pomeroy had 22; of 161 votes in precinct number two he had 25. Out of a total vote of 327 he had 47. Does that look as though he was defrauded of the delegations from Kalispell primaries? and yet the story is being industriously circulated that the 280 votes against him were cast by hoboes and hoodlums. Are seven eighths of the republican voters of these two precincts hoboes? More than 100 of these voters are outside of the town of Kalispell. Are these voters all hoboes? On Mr. Pomeroy's tickets for delegates and alternates in Kalispell precincts were 72 names, and he had 47 votes. If none but those on his own tickets had voted he would have barely been successful in carrying the delegations.

In the county convention a rising vote for temporary chairman gave Mr. Wallace, the McIntire candidate, 48 votes; and Mr. Schonfeldt the Pomeroy candidate, 31 votes. He was fairly beaten on that proposition. As soon as the convention was organized the resolution referred to elsewhere was explained, introduced, read and adopted exactly as stated. These are facts that cannot be denied, yet in the face of all the people of the district are told that he was cheated and tricked in that convention. He was fairly and squarely beaten. Professing to be an ardent republican, and presenting himself as a candidate, he was bound by every consideration of political honor and political decency to abide by the result. Instead of that he does not hesitate to attempt to disrupt and defeat the republican party in this county to further his own ends.

His candidacy is not based on his superior qualifications for the office, but on an appeal for sympathy, and denouncing those who opposed him as tricksters and frauds.

In the judicial convention Mr. McIntire received the unanimous support of Teton county delegates as well as those of Flathead county. The chairman of the Teton delegation nominated Mr. McIntire, his nomination was seconded by another Teton delegate, and the nomination was made unanimous. Members of the delegation say that at that time Mr. Pomeroy said he would acquiesce in the decision of the convention, and that he endorsed the action of the Teton delegates.—Kalispell Inter Lake.

Alex. C. Botkin was elected as delegate to congress by the people of Montana in 1882, and was deprived of his election by such acts as running full train loads of railroad laborers from Thompson to Horse Plains and Weeksville, voting them at every precinct and rolling up a fictitious majority for Maginnis in those three precincts of 826; stuffing 500 straight democratic tickets in the ballot box at Miles city before they were opened to count; counting a large democratic majority from a fictitious precinct which was given the name of Wooley's ranch, but which never had an existence, and by bulldozing of the worst type in Choteau county, in which the democratic county officials of that county were the chief actors. The old timers of Montana have not forgotten that outrage on the sanctity of the ballot, and many democrats who were here then will embrace the opportunity to register their disapproval. Col. Botkin will run away beyond his regular party vote, and will surely leave behind in the race that political trimmer for office, Bob Smith, who was a democrat until he could not get an office through that party, a populist looking for a democratic endorsement two years ago in order to get Charlie Hartman's place; and is this year, as he has always been at heart, a democrat, but posing as a populist that the gubernatorial nomination might come to him through the populist party in the abandonment of principle and political prostitution which resulted in the hermaphrodite ticket nominated at Missoula.—Ravalli Republican.
