Supposed To Be Stolen.

The following is a description of horses imported by halfbreed Pocha from Montana on or about the 20th August.

These horses are in custody of the police at Macleod for the evasion of custom duties. One or two have been claimed as stolen horses, and a description of the whole band is published. Montana papers please copy.

1. Bay yearling filly, off hind pastern white, light points branded 3L near shoulder.

2. Bay yearling filly, no white, no brand.

3. 1 bay gelding, 8 years, 14 hands, P near hip. Off hind coronet white, shod behind.

4. 1 light roan gelding, 7 years, 14 hands, broad white stripe over forehead down over face and nose, both lips white off foreknee and pastern white, while extending up front of leg to knee, both hind legs white, no brand.

5. Bay gelding, 2 years. 24-3, LP FOX near shoulder, LP near hip star near hind fetlock, white of fore coronet scarred from rope.

6. Light roan gelding, 4 years, KV off hip, blazed face, all four legs white, splashed white on lower jaw, neck and hips, light mane and tail, 14 hands.

7. Bay gelding, 8 years, 15 hands C near shoulder, star spot on nose lower lip white, both fore and nigh hind fetlocks white.

8. Buckskin gelding, 3 years, 15 hands, C near shoulder, no white, black points first two lines of heavy.

9. Chestnut mare, 3 years, 15 hands an ill-drawn maltese cross off shoulder white strip down face, unbroken.

10. Brown gelding, 4 years, 15-2 hands, FNS near hip, near fore pastern and near hind fetlock white.

11. White pinto gelding, 7 years, 14-3 hands P, hear hip, M off hip, dark spot on top of head, dark over loins, tip of hip and rump, dark hairs in tail.

12. Bay gelding, 4 years, 15 hands, MHL (monogram) near hip, and white, near hind fetlock crooked.

13. Bay mare, 8 years 15 2 hands P near hip, near fore fetlock and both hind legs white, outside of fore coronet white, blazed face, lower lip white.

14. Roan mare, 7 years, 15-2 hands LA near hip, white strip down face and over nose, 1/2 lower lip white off hind coronet white.—Ex.

Prince Tuan in Favor.

London, Oct. 16.—Hong Kong dispatches tell of the continued spread of the southern rebellion. The Hong Kong correspondent of the Daily Express sends a report that the British torpedo boat destroyer Handy shelled two thousand rebels who were advancing on San Chuu, killing forty and wounding hundreds. This is not corroborated from any other point.

The evidence of Prince Tuan's continuance in power causes anxiety. According to the Shanghai correspondent of the Morning Post, it has produced a serious depression in trade here. Two Chinese banks have failed there, two others are expected to close, and it is reported the Russo-Chinese bank is in difficulties, owing to the removal of the Chinese court to the province of Shensi, Shanghai reports that local mandarins have received a dispatch from Prince Tuan announcing that the court is now in safe keeping and exhorting them to have patience until winter decimates the rllies, to keep the peasants in constant work and "everything is in readiness for a massacre of all foreigners when the proper time arises."

Berlin, Oct. 16.—The Frankfurter Zeitung prints a telegram from Shanghai today which says that Emperor Kwang Su arrived at Sian Fu. The foreign office has no official information of the whereabouts of the Chinese court.

A high official of the foreign office, discussing the general situation this afternoon said: "There is absolutely nothing new in the diplomatic situation. We have received no information as to the alleged difficulties encountered by Count Walderssee in getting all the allies to recognize his authority, but it lies in the very nature of the case that he would meet with some trouble in bringing them all under one head general.
