### Frazier On Bolshivism.

Here in North Dakota we believe the best protection against revolution is to assist rather than retard evolution and in this state it is the intention of the administration to remove discontent and prevent disorder by remedying the legitimate economic complaints of the people instead of trying to stamp out just grievances. As a consequence we have a contented citizenry in North Dakota which believes in upholding our government and achieving political progress by orderly and constitutional methods.

I want to warn you against the danger of allowing this move to be misdirected into a camouflaged campaign against these liberal forces in America which stand for the improvement of industrial and political conditions.

Personally, I feel that bolshevism is not the only peril to this country. In my opinion the spirit of bourgeoisism is even more threatening to the security of our institutions, for, scanning back through history, it seems to me that bourgeoisism always precedes and is the cause of bolshevism. It was bourgeoisism that resulted in the French revolution, and it was the oppression of the czar that is primarily responsible for the present unhappy plight of Russia. I can not help feeling the bolsheviks are the effect of centuries of semi-oriental despotism and that the chief blame for present conditions in Russia must be traced to the doors of the reactionary Romanoffs.

I trust that your association perceives the necessity of progress and realizes changing economic and industrial conditions demand intelligent legislation and new governmental activities.

If you possess this vision, your campaign will be of inestimable benefit, for after all education is the real solvent of our problems, but if you permit yourselves to be as shock troops in the fight which certain sinister interests are conducting against desired governmental changes in this country, your influence will be harmful instead of helpful.

### PROVINCIAL HAIL INSURANCE ACT

A review of the new provincial (municipal) hail insurance act issued by the board in charge of its administration discloses many interesting points concerning the operation of the measure. In discussing the act, it must be remembered that Albert is divided into municipalities and rural municipalities, and the act is to be administered separately by municipalities.

The act was largely the outcome of dissatisfaction with the methods of hail insurance companies, and the onerous terms they imposed. This was not altogether the fault of the companies as, owing to the blanket manner in which their business covered hail and non-hail areas alike, some of them were badly hit in years of excessive hail, so badly in fact, that numerous companies absolutely refused to write further business.

**Stumbling Block.** When the provincial legislature proceeded to take up the subject of establishing hail insurance, the first stumbling block was the question of whether the act should be province wide, administered uniformly in all sections, or whether local government should prevail. Members from the most northerly sections of the province loudly protested that farmers in their districts did not know what hail was and refused to be burdened with taxes to help pay losses in other sections.

Eventually, after a special committee had investigated and special hail areas were mapped out from accurate weather records, the act was established on the following lines:

**How Administered.** Management in the hands of a board of directors elected by representatives of various municipal units. Rates levied by the board and collected by municipal councils. Revenue to be derived from levy on crop area only.

Levy to be made in the fall and to be sufficient to cover costs of administration, awards in full, and create a surplus of not less than 10 per cent and not more than 20 per cent of the indemnity for that year.

When the surplus equals 8 per cent of the total insurance in force, the levy ceases until the surplus falls below that figure.

The act applies to all portions of the province south of the North Saskatchewan river and to the block of land containing approximately 3,500 square miles north of that river.

**Many Districts.** There are about 140 municipal districts in the area to which the act applies. In each of these districts, the act must be submitted to the electors in the form of a by-law to be voted on at the next annual municipal election in February, 1919.

If the act is approved in 45 or more of these districts, it comes into force and a hail insurance district will be created embracing those districts voting its favor. Any municipality formed after this vote, or any municipality which voted against it, may vote again to be embraced in the hail insurance district. Any individual whose crop is in a district voting against the plan may have his crop insured individually, and any municipal district may withdraw after 5 years and when less than 45 municipal districts remain, the minister of municipalities has power to disorganize the district and wind up its affairs.

**Can Borrow Money.** The board can borrow the money required to carry on the business to be repaid later out of taxes levied for hail insurance purposes, and the province can guarantee the loan.

Hay of any kind is not insured. All crops of wheat, oats, barley, flax, rye and speltz may be insured from June 15 to September 15, and fall wheat and rye from June 1 to September 15 both dates inclusive.

### LEAGUE SENATOR IS UNSEATED

(Minnesota Leader.) What the Leader predicted has taken place. The servile, cowardly Minnesota senate has unseated Senator Wilcox of Washington county, who was elected with the Nonpartisan League endorsement by a majority vote of his county. The pretext for this action was discussed in this column last week. It remains to discuss the dishonest and contemptible steps taken by the senate to save its face and square itself before the outraged electorate of Washington county and the people of the state.

While unseating Wilcox, as per schedule, the senate has refused to seat Sullivan, his opponent and the contestant for the seat. At the last minute it was decided that that would be too raw. And so, while kicking a duly elected senator out and thus vetoing the majority vote of the citizens of Washington county, the senate has ordered a special primary to be held February 18 and a special election to be held February 20 to fill the vacant seat.

Of course Senator Wilcox will run at this special primary and election. But it is hoped by the Burnquist ring and reactionary senate gang that enough sentiment has been worked up against Mr. Wilcox through the adverse publicity he has received on account of the case to defeat him and return Sullivan. At the same time the senate thinks it has avoided criticism by not seating a man who was clearly not wanted in the senate by the people of his county.

We are told that this decision is a "fair compromise," but like all compromises made by politicians to avoid criticism and placate both sides, it is the reconstruction period after a rank injustice. You can't compromise between right and wrong. Senator Wilcox was duly elected. The pretext urged by Sullivan to unseat him was a farce. It is not justice to Wilcox, to the League or to the people of Washington county to unseat him, even if, at the same time, the claims of Sullivan to the seat are also denied. The senate was right in refusing to seat Sullivan, but being right in that does not make it right for the senate to unseat Wilcox, who was clearly elected. Committing one right act does not make up for committing another act which is grossly wrong.

The senate wanted to seat Sullivan and unseat Wilcox. It didn't have the courage of its convictions. It was cowardly. So it has ordered a special election in the hope that Sullivan can pull through with the aid of untrue and contemptible charges that have been made against Wilcox and the League during the time the case was before the senate.

What will be the answer of the people of Washington county to this at special primary February 13 and the special election February 20. Can there be any doubt.
