TO BE SETTLED ON MAY 8TH. THE DISTRICT COMMITTEE DEFERRED ACTION UPON ILLEGAL VOTING.

Judge Little Appears With a Long List of Illegal Voters and Names of County Voters, and is ready to Purge the McLean Vote.

The Democratic executive committee of the Fourth Judicial district met yesterday afternoon in the parlor of the Planters House.

The object of the meeting was stated by the chairman to be to receive and count the vote of the primary election held March 13th, in Daviess, Hancock and McLean counties, as certified by the county committees.

Mr. Duncan reported the vote of Hancock as certified by only two members of the county committee, no quorum having assembled to count it, and further reported that L. P. Little had appeared before them and filed a notice of contest served on W. T. Owen, both being candidates for circuit judge, together with a written petition, specifying the names and number of alleged illegal votes which were cast for Owen and the ground of his objections to such votes, praying that they be expunged and that they refer the matter to the district committee.

Mr. Gates reported the vote of McLean county, and Mr. Millett reported the vote of Daviess, the latter report containing no reference to the contest before the Daviess county committee.

The reports were all received and filed. The vote of the three counties as reported was as follows:

Mr. Duncan then moved to adjourn until May 8th, but Judge L. P. Little being present and desiring to address the committee, the motion was withdrawn and Judge Little was granted an audience.

Judge Little read the following memorial, accompanying it with a few pertinent remarks:

To the District Committee of the Fourth Judicial District: The undersigned says that at a primary held March 13th, 1886, in the counties of Daviess, Hancock and McLean, he and W. T. Owen were competing candidates for the Democratic nomination for circuit judge.

At the said primary election no one was entitled to vote save members of the Democratic party, and only those in the respective voting precincts in which they resided, and were entitled to vote by law at regular State and county elections. Yet he says that divers and sundry persons did vote in said primary election who were not Democrats, and not entitled to vote therein, who voted out of the precinct and some out of the county of their residence. He said that many persons voted twice in said election, and some who did not vote at all were recorded as voting—and others who voted for the undersigned were recorded as voting for said Owen.

He says that divers fraudulent practices were resorted to to prevent a fair and honest expression of the Democratic will. He says that persons inimical to the election of the undersigned caused to be printed and published at the "Inquirer" newspaper office, in Owensboro, Ky., a circular, falsely purporting to emanate from your body, in which "everybody" was given permission to vote. As a consequence of this device a large number of persons, especially in Hancock county, were allowed to vote—who were not entitled to do so—and the bulk of those unauthorized votes were cast for said Owen.

He further says that at the earliest date practicable after said primary election, viz: On March 15, 1886, he gave written notice to his competitor, W. T. Owen, that he would apply to the county committees in said three counties to expunge all undemocratic votes recorded on the respective poll-books, and to correct all votes improperly recorded. A copy of said notice will accompany this memorial.

The county committee of McLean met prior to the time fixed by your body for comparing the polls and certified the result thereof, and on this account the undersigned was deprived of an opportunity of appearing personally
