TERRIBLE DEED

Of an Insane Wife and Mother—Drowned Children and Self.

Fall River, Mass., Feb. 22.—The officers of the steamer Plymouth, of the Fall River line, found a part of a woman's wearing apparel and a note saying that she had thrown her three children overboard and was about to follow them herself in a steamer just after the steamer left Newport on her trip from New York to this city.

The woman is believed to have been Mrs. John Waters, of Brooklyn, N. Y., a daughter of Capt. James Brady, Collector of the Port of Fall River.

Among the letters left by the woman was one addressed to John W. Waters, 170 Broadway, New York.

The steamer occupied by the woman was engaged in New York under the name of B. T. Allen. She is described as being about 35 years old and well dressed.

The three children included a girl about eight years of age, and two smaller children believed to be boys—one a nursing infant.

The letters found, apparently were intended for the woman's husband, one asking forgiveness and saying that she had worried so much that she feared insanity and could not leave the children.

After having searched the boat and found no trace of the woman or the children, the officers became convinced that the woman had thrown them overboard and leaped after them.

John D. Rockefeller worked in a machine shop. Thomas F. Ryan was a clerk in a dry goods store.


