PEACE DELEGATES CHOSEN.

American Participants in Disarmament Congress Selected.
 WASHINGTON, April 7.—The secretary of state has announced the constitution of the United States delegation to the disarmament congress, which will meet at The Hague in the latter part of May. The delegation consists of Andrew D. White, United States ambassador at Berlin; Mr. Newell, United States minister to the Netherlands; President Seth Low of the Columbia university, New York; Captain Crozier, ordnance department U. S. A., and Captain A. T. Mahan, retired, U. S. A. Mr. Frederick Hollis of New York will be secretary of the delegation.

Railroad Building In 1899.
 CHICAGO, April 7.—There is every indication that not less than 5,000 miles of new railway will be built in the United States in 1899, representing an investment of about \$150,000,000. Many important extensions and connecting links are being undertaken by some of the largest systems in the west. The Illinois Central line will add nearly 200 miles of line, including its Omaha extension, 130 miles. The Chicago and Northwestern has 187 miles under contract in Minnesota and Iowa, which is being built principally to give that company a more direct line between St. Paul and Minneapolis and Omaha.

Iowa Bankers to Meet.
 CEDAR RAPIDS, Ia., April 7.—At a meeting of the council of administration of the Iowa Bankers' association here yesterday it was decided to hold the annual convention at Burlington on June 14 and 15. A program was formulated. A number of topics will be discussed and among the speakers will be Hon. James H. Eckels and President Stickney of the Chicago Great Western.

Chicago Traction Pool Likely.
 CHICAGO, April 7.—The Chronicle says that a syndicate composed of New York, Philadelphia and Chicago men identified with Metropolitan traction of New York and other cities, has been formed and is now negotiating for the purchase and consolidation of all the Chicago traction companies, surface and elevated, with good prospects of a successful conclusion.






BATTLEFIELDS IN THE PHILIPPINES.
