THEY TAKE MANY PRIZES

McHenry Herd of Aberdeen
Angus Cattle are Winners

LIST OF THEIR MANY WINNINGS

The Great Sale at South Omaha December 17
Will Give All A Chance to Secure
Animals From This Famous Herd.

Again Iowa is at the front, and Crawford county "strictly in it," and Mr. McHenry maintains Denison's reputation of capturing what she goes after in earnest. Yesterday's awards at the great International Stock Exposition at Chicago are given to the Aberdeen-Angus at Denison, Iowa, as follows:

- First premium on aged herd.
- First premium on young herd.
- First premium on get of bull (Heather Blackbird).
- First premium on produce of cow (Barbara McHenry).
- First premium on junior champion heifer (Barbara McHenry 13th).
- First and second on two-year-old heifer.
- First and second on one-year-old heifer.
- Second on sale bull Baltimore.
- Second on two-year-old bull, Royal Laddie, who was out-classed only by his full brother.
- First on heifer calf, but for second place Mr. McHenry lost to a daughter out of his Pride McHenry 4th, which he recently sold to Mr. Karnahan.
- The cow Lucia, which was burned with acid last summer, was given second place, but she will no doubt be given the first premium as the cow awarded first does not come within the requirements of the Exposition rules, being barren, and unless she drops a calf by March 1 the award will go to the McHenry Park cow.

This is indeed a wonderful showing for Mr. McHenry's herd and speaks volumes for the study and attention given to the business of live stock, which is so fast making Iowa the richest and best state of the Union. Mr. Johnson, the herdsman, is entitled to great praise for the successful preparation of the cattle and he is acknowledged second to none in the art of finishing cattle for show and the butcher's block.

Mr. McHenry's sale of this year's bulls, together with 30 head of females, will take place at South Omaha, Neb., Stock Yards Pavilion, December 17, at 10 o'clock, and our farmers should bring every bull back to Crawford county instead of allowing the stock men of other states to get them, and thus be able to furnish a better grade of beef than can be produced here.

A petition of voluntary bankruptcy was filed in the federal court yesterday. Last week Schade Brothers of Manilla, Ia. gave chattle mortgages on all their stock of farming implements to farmers living in that section, leaving out implement houses who were their heavy creditors. The Rock Island Plow Co., T. G. Northwell & Co. and David Bradley & Co. in the petition of bankruptcy seek to vacate the chattle mortgages and compel an equitable division of the stock. They have therefore applied for a restraining order to keep the Schades from disposing of the stock. The application has been sent to Judge McPherson for immediate action. The claim of the Rock Island Plow Co. is \$1,100, T. G. Northwell & Co. \$225 and David Bradley & Co. \$124. The Peru Plow and Wheel Co. are said to be creditors to the amount of \$1,100, while the McCormick Harvesting and Machine Co. has a claim of \$700. There are also various other creditors.




