### German Lutheran.

#### CHILDREN'S CHRISTMAS CELEBRATION

At the German Lutheran church, Monday evening, beginning at 7 p. m., sharp, and taking up about two hours time, the annual children's Christmas festival will take place in the usual manner. All the scholars of the Parochial school, twenty-eight in number, and many of the Sunday school, fifty in number, likewise the church choir, the congregation and the pastor will take part.  
The program consists of appropriate songs by the children, hymns by the congregation, a cantata by the choir, and catechetical instruction in questions and answers by the pastor and children. Each of the scholars and

many of the Sunday school will deliver pieces, single, two or three, four, five or even six at once, each taking a part. Four of the children, two boys and two girls, will sing a cantata of six different melodies. The choir will render a grand Hallelujah and a transcription of the angelic message, "Glory to God in the Highest, and on Earth Peace, Good Will to all Men."

The church will be crowded to its utmost capacity, as usual, even should weather and ways be unfavorable. The Christmas tree will be resplendent with candles and glittering ornaments. After the program, bags with candy, nuts, apples, oranges, etc., and books and cakes will be dealt out to the children, and presents to adults.




