they were acquired, and such other obligations as are imposed by international law. If these islands are retained, they must either be organized into territories, preparatory to their admission as states into the Union, or the United States must pursue a policy toward them differing materially from anything for which there is a precedent in our history. I doubt exceedingly, if the people of the United States are prepared to sanction the sale or gift of these islands to any foreign power, and I am no less doubtful of the wisdom of their immediate or remote admission into the Union, but unless one or the other is done, I repeat there is nothing left but a policy unlike anything which has heretofore been pursued. You may call that imperialism or what you please. The independence of these islands with an American protectorate has no express warrant in the constitution, and it is in direct conflict with the traditions of the fathers. It therefore becomes a question of wisdom and not of sentiment, and in its determination the nation has right to demand the counsel and support of every man who can think and who can hold his conduct in obedience to his conservative judgment. The worst criticism I bring against those with whom you will doubtless be engaged in a life long contest for the political supremacy of this country is, that they seem anxious to discover an issue on which a campaign can be won, than to formulate a policy for the wise conduct of public affairs after they have achieved their victory. With a high sense of our responsibilities, with exact justice and in their interest of the inhabitants of these possessions, be they willing or unwilling wards, we must advance gradually, step by step, as we have gone thus far, and thus doing I have no question that out of it all will come great good to them and good to us, and good to the world. The flag of your country has never yet cast a shadow upon any land and has never waved above any people except to bless them and, blessed be God, it never shall."
