Denison Man Sees Minnesota.

PHILBROOK, Minn., Dec. 10, 1901.—Editor Review. Dear Sir: I have been thinking that perhaps some of your readers would be interested in Minnesota land, so I concluded to write a sketch of my trip.

We left Denison on the night of Dec. 2d via the I. C. route. At Ft. Dodge a crowd of land seekers came in that nearly filled the car and more came in at most all stations until we had traveled quite a distance in Minnesota. We were not in the smoking car, but as there were no ladies in the car it was not long until things were blue with smoke.

They were drinking, singing, yelling and dancing all night. Nobody could sleep or feel comfortable. When we arrived at Forrest City we heard the cry of "snow," which however was only light. After we crossed the line our first stop was ten minutes for lunch at Albert Lea which looked to be quite a large place with electric lights. Of course we could see nothing of the country till we were near Minneapolis. It was quite broken and covered with oak and some pine grubs, dotted with numerous lakes which would make beautiful scenery in summer. Arriving at Minneapolis we realized that the people were thoroughly awake and up-to-date. Everybody was rushing here and there. All the passengers but three left; our car finally pulling out for St. Paul. We expected to see things nearly the same but were considerably disappointed. Very few passengers, street cars running empty or nearly so most of the time. We never saw so many empty store rooms and handsome residences as there. We stayed until Wednesday morning and took in most of the city. We visited the Indian mounds, seven in number, which stand on the bank of the Mississippi. We climbed to the top of two of them which afforded a beautiful view of the river both ways. With our glass we could see other towns miles away. The government fisheries are just below. Just above stands the ruins of a forty thousand dollar residence made of brick and the most beautifully carved stone that we ever saw in a building. Leaving there at 8:30 a. m. we started on our journey north and west. After getting out a few miles we came into as beautiful a country as ever laid out of doors. Level with now and then a swail running through just enough to drain the land. Every now and then a lake. Just after we left Lake City, Minn., a man who

boarded the train there pointed out a beautiful farm house; must have had nine or ten rooms, with large barns and out buildings, the land nearly as level as a floor and about ten or fifteen feet above the level of the lakes. He said it sold for \$30.00 per acre. A few miles further we dashed into more rough land covered with grubs and boulders some ten or fifteen feet square, then rougher and more boulders in heaps as large as a good sized house. Then in a few minutes we were out in as fine a prairie as the eye could wish to look upon, finally arriving at Little Falls which has a population of 7,000. We had to change cars. Stopped there from 1 p. m. till 8:30 p. m. We talked with a farmer who had 80 acres of land and said there were four kinds of soil on the 80 acres and that it was about the average of land. Spots of the best of soil and spots of sandy soil. This seems to be about the run of land all through these parts. Where there has been hard wood there is good soil, and the pine land is sandy. There has been heavy timber nearly all over but it has all been cut off.

Judge Conner has interested himself especially in the proposed and much needed federal building at Boone and his standing as a member of the committee on Public Buildings should do much to assure the people of that thriving city that Boone is soon to be remembered with a building which will be a credit to that place. We congratulate Boone as much as we do Judge Conner and we believe the people of that county will appreciate the efforts which Judge Conner will surely make in their behalf.
