On Monday afternoon of last week, at Omaha, I had the pleasure of listening to the great violinist, Jan Kubelik, who is now touring this country. It was a wonderful performance. His violin spoke as never mine spake and at his appearance, there was no more room for melody, harmony, inspiration, interpretation or technique, (whatever that is.) Everything, to me, seemed perfect. The ease and grace which the great boy displayed in his renditions of the seemingly impossible were as perfect as the discordant awkwardness of the thousands upon thousands of us, who "saw" Traveler de Arkansaw. He played, and the applause was deafening and without cessation until he re-appeared. In their efforts to show appreciation, that vast audience out-did itself and yet fell far short of an expression of that inward feeling which I leave you to describe.

Jan Kubelik is modest, unpretentious and manly, and did not play with the air of one who thought he was "the only one," and while people were not inclined to contest his right to that title, you could notice that there would have been no objection from Kubelik had they done so.

Let me repeat, please, that the performance of Kubelik was wonderful, seemingly supernatural, and the general verdict that "I never heard anything like it," as true and as unsolicited in his case as it ever was in mine.

I heard the great violinist, I can not find language to express how much I enjoyed it; and now to show that I wish to do all that is fair in the matter I wish to express the hope that, at sometime when he is not otherwise engaged, Kubelik may hear me.

The Denison Review of Tuesday makes a great blow about the real estate transfers in Crawford county for two days, March 3 and 4 and, in truth, the county has some cause for self-congratulation. The aggregate values of the real estate transferred on those two days was \$328,407.75.

But we wish to call the Review's attention to the transfers in Harrison county for the same two days. The aggregate amount was \$335,953.00 or \$7,545.25 more than in Crawford county. The total amount for the week ending March 8 in Harrison county were nearly a million dollars—\$842,657.00.
