The Holden Extension.

In presenting the Holden Extension property to the people of Denison, I have endeavored to be reasonable and strictly within the bounds of truth. We know that we have a good and meritorious proposition.

We know that its possibilities are very great. But we know also that as is the case with our neighbor, the Holden mine, the truth seems too great. Among mining men, the truth will scarcely be believed. They must see it in order to believe. While among people not versed in mining, the truth cannot well be understood. The magnitude of the Holden mine, or even of the ore body in the Holden extension is in comprehensible to most any man.

Strange as it may seem this has not long been appreciated even in Washington, but when one great mine becomes established in a district it turns the eyes of the whole mining world to that district.

The Le Roi mine did this for the Roseland district in British Columbia. Stratton's Independence did it for Cripple Creek. The Calumet and Hecla for the Michigan copper mines. The Dewy mine is now doing it for Thunder Mountain, Idaho. And the Holden mine for the Chelan district in Washington. Capitalists are even now looking to that district, and with the passing of the snow in the mountains a period of activity will be inaugurated never before felt in the district. This means that other mining properties will be developed and operated. That other smelter propositions will be put on foot. That other transportation lines will be constructed, besides those that are being put in for the Holden mine. I speak advisedly on this subject. There are other good properties tributary to Lake Chelan, and their development will add millions to the wealth of the state and of the nation. Mining is in its infancy in Washington. It offers excellent opportunities for investments in that line.

COURT MILL STILL GRINDS

DULL AND UNINTERESTING CIVIL CASES THIS WEEK

Ringer Case Set For Next Tuesday Will Interest Denison People.

The case of Roggenkamp vs Weinbrant was the first jury case to be tried and was called on Tuesday. It involved the possession of a cow. It was claimed by John Roggenkamp as his by purchase from his wife and the claim of the defendant was that the cow they had and which the plaintiff sought to replevin was not the same one that he alleged he bought from his wife, but was in fact a different cow. The jury sustained this claim and found for the defendant.

The case of Romans vs Whiting involving the possession of a farm claimed by Whiting to have been rented to him by Romans was the next case. The Court took the case away from the Jury this morning and instructed them to return a verdict for the plaintiff, R. A. Romans. This has the effect of giving him possession of the farm.

This is all the jury work completed this week. However a large number of cases have been disposed of. Several unhappy married couples have had their troubles discontinued through the medium of divorces. The divorce cases tried and decrees rendered were Bahsen vs Bahsen, Hill vs Hill and Stone vs Stone.

There were several cases continued until next term among which was the state vs Butler which was continued on account of the disability of Mr. Lally who represents the defendant.

The state cases set down for trial are State vs David Ringer indicted for assault on C. W. Menagh which will be tried on Tuesday; State vs John Jackson, indicted for breaking the jail at Maquilla and assisting a prisoner to escape which will be tried Tuesday and the State vs Sweeny and Rohan indicted for breaking and entering the residence of George Lingle last Saturday evening. It is the expectation that these two individuals will be retired from circulation for a while at least.

On Monday the case of the State ex. rel Lizzie Mundt vs Henry Meir will be taken up; this being a matter where the plaintiff gave birth to an illegitimate child and seeks to compel its father (who she claims is the defendant) to support it. This will probably be a hotly contested case. The way business has opened up this term would warrant the belief that a large number of cases will be disposed of.

There have been a large grist assigned for this term and it is expected that next week will be steadily taken up with the trial of jury cases. The grand jury has considered a number of cases and examined a great many witnesses but have as yet indicted in no case save the matter of the burglary of George Lingle's house. It is the expectation however that some other indictments will be returned. Among other matters considered by them was the charge against E. S. Barnes of disposing of mortgaged property and two witnesses were present from Sioux City to testify in the matter.

In the case of B. F. Lawson vs Crawford County, being an action by Lawson who formerly lived at Manila for constables fees amounting to some \$65 which the county refused to pay. He brought suit for the same and the Court Thursday sustained the demurrer filed by the County to his petition.
