

### LETTER FROM THE PHILIPPINES.

C. K. Shafer tells of The Doings In Cavite.

U. S. Naval Station, Cavite, P. I. Dec. 1901.

A week ago Sunday I went to Manila. The occasion was the opening of the new temporary chapel of the M. E. church and they were naturally very proud of it. Of course it is plain. The thing that attracted me most was the matting used on walls and ceiling. It was simply 4 inch strips of bamboo

plaited and for a change it looks as well as plaster. They were very anxious to get it done before Dr. Stuntz went away and I guess they had a big time the night before and early morning to clean up and arrange things. The house was filled. Rev. Stuntz has now gone to the U. S. to remain about 6 months. He will raise money for a college and bring his wife and children back with him. While I was over to Manila and could not get back till evening I used opportunity to go out to Bilibid, the prison and penitentiary of Manila and the Island. Of course we saw no one working but were simply in a sleeping room or dormitory of the white prisoners. The beds were of bamboo, a regular "Filipino bed", instead of a woven mat or surface for lying on, these had nothing but strips of bamboo running lengthwise about 1 inch wide and 2 inch thick. While this is of course better than a board it is not a "soft snap" anyway.

Christmas has passed off quietly. Stayed at home ate good dinner and supper. I thought how you were perhaps eating stewed snowballs and fried bicycles at home. On Xmas eve the town grew lively and masqueraded around in costume. Part of it was similar to the parade of the fiesta. I guess the natives rather like to "dress up" on occasion. Tonight there is a grand all to be held here in Cavite. As no mail will go out for several days anyway I will defer comment on the event until "After the Ball." I think I mentioned that it cost \$20.00 Mexican to be a "member." I declined.

Thursday 2nd. I intended to go to Manila a while yesterday p. m. to attend the Y. M. C. A. New Years reception there but I did not find out till too late that the p. m. boat did not run so was disappointed. I could have gone over in the morning if I had known. Of course there was nothing going on here to attract one except a game of base ball in the p. m. The day was mostly cloudy and I spent most of my time in reading. We were favored with a good bountiful nourishment again though the duck was tough. We had some left for supper and I wouldn't be surprised if it turned up in hash in a day or two. The Commandant had a reception in the evening from 4 to 6. He is quite a nice man. On the last mail I received my Spanish books from Chicago so I can study if the spell takes me. I have relearned all I thought I knew on the ship. The Insular Gov't no longer takes Mexican money at 2 for 1 but for the next 3 months at least it will take \$2.10 of Mexican to equal \$1 gold. The post office too has adapted it and still they will not accept Mexican for money orders payable in U. S. Before it went into effect I bought about \$20 or \$22 Mex. of stamps cards etc. so I will have enough to last me while here I guess. It will be an awful nuisance for the P. O. people as well as for patrons. I tell you there are some sore and aching heads "after the ball" due to the abundance of liquid refreshments. I understand there will be an extra assessment to meet the bill. I am "gladder" than ever that I am out of it. There was quite a large crowd out and they all said they had a good time. I heard the band play while lying in my bed. They talked of having it in our house but didn't. A notice is posted now that mail will leave Manila on the 4th and 7th inst so I am afraid this will not reach you the 1st of Feb. Sometimes they make good time though. I'm not asking how you spent your Xmas and New Years for I know you'll write it. We had a real warm day again today. My thermometer was about 86 degrees. We also had a nice rain last night. I do not know if I have remarked that thunder and lightning are rarely experienced since I am here at least. Affectionately, CECIL.
