SIRES AND SONS.

One of the Japanese field marshals, Marquis Yamagata, is sixty-six years old and looks decrepit, although he is full of energy.

Andrew Carnegie gave the money for the nineteen library buildings erected during the last eighteen months in the province of Ontario, Canada.

John D. Strassburg of Louisville, Ky., who is supposed to be the oldest employee in the postal service of the country, has just completed the sixty-first year of his service.

William Nelson Cromwell, head of the New York firm which had much to do in procuring ratification of the Panama canal treaty, is said to have received a fee of \$2,000,000.

Dr. Bishop, mayor of Fond du Lac, Wis., announces that he has determined to withdraw entirely from politics and will not be a candidate for reelection. His medical practice, he says, demands his whole attention.

Emile Terquem, who is to be in charge of the French book exhibit at the St. Louis fair, gained his first experience thirty years ago. He was in charge at the Centennial at Chicago in 1893 and at Paris in 1878, 1880 and 1900.

General Dick, the new senator from Ohio, was assigned to a seat in the rear row, the "Cherokee strip." When he went to the house he was similarly located there and at subsequent biennial lotteries for seats he fared little better. Always his place was in one of the two rear rows.

A Famous Saucer.

Only a saucer remains of the porcelain set presented in 1783 to Martha Washington. This is carefully preserved in the Smithsonian institution at Washington. In the center appears the monogram of "M. and W." for Martha and Washington, and about the edge is the name of every state which was then in the Union.

PEN, CHISEL AND BRUSH.

Stephen Powers, a well known Georgia editor and author, died recently. Stanley Todd, a nephew of ex-Mayor Low of New York, has just completed a life size portrait of President Roosevelt, which is to be exhibited at the St. Louis exposition.

Paul Adam, the French sculptor, has been commissioned by the minister of public instruction of France to come to America and study the French influence on American art.

Georg Brandes has begun to issue his autobiography in a Copenhagen journal. He relates that when he was a youth of eighteen he often was seized by an uncontrollable fit of laughter, and this caused him to investigate the subject of laughter and to write a long treatise on it.
