On motion official bond of A. J. Bond, assessor of city of Denison was approved.

Bids for county physician for a term of one year were opened and were as follows: Dr. R. P. Plimpton, \$390.00; Dr. A. L. Randall, \$300.00; Dr. W. T. Wright, \$200.00.

Resolved by the board that Dr. Wright be awarded the contract for county physician for a term of one year, beginning July 1st, 1904, at \$290.00, per annum.

Resolved by the board that contract entered into by and between the Sisters of Mercy, of Council Bluffs, Iowa, and Crawford county, for the care, nursing and

medical attendance at the rate of \$65.00 per week during sickness and for other paupers at a rate of \$10.00 per month is hereby approved.

Resolved by the board that whereas Amelia O. Anderson and husband having conveyed unto Crawford county by warranty deed, lot eight, block one hundred thirty-two, Denison Iowa, for the consideration of \$500.00, same being paid in and furnished them by said county is thereby approved.

Resolved by the board that the county treasurer redeem from tax sale Number one hundred seventeen, of year 1901, lot eight, block one hundred thirty-two, Denison, Iowa, same being county property.

Resolved by the board of supervisors that the court house building committee is authorized to pay the contractors on monthly estimates of architects according to stipulations in contract

Resolved by the board that H. C. Schroeder, C. H. Moller, John Cook, John Holland and Thomas Ahart be a committee to let any contractor for steel or iron bridges, to accept the same, to continue any contract, or cancel the same, or make new contracts as in their judgement seems best to protect the county interests, the authority of this committee to act shall cease first Monday in January 1905.

Resolved by the board that the wages for the working of the One Mile road tax for year 1904, be fixed as follows: one man with team, thirty-two and one-half cents per hour; man without team, seven

teen and one-half cents per hour, reserving the right to let by contract and the county auditor be authorized to issue warrant to said supervisor when said claim has been worked out and an itemized statement properly presented, and that the said amounts be divided in each of the supervisors districts:

THE BUTTERFLY.

Some of the Extraordinary Gifts of This Silent Insect.

The extraordinary gifts of the butterfly race have always excited the wonder not only of naturalists, but of the most ignorant observers—their silent and unseen changes, the instinct by which they distinguish their favorite plant food—as, for instance, even among the scarcely differing species of the complex race of asters, where they show themselves, as Professor Asa Gray said, "better botanists than many of us;" their skill in depositing their eggs unerringly on or near the precise plant on which the forthcoming caterpillars are fitted to feed, although they as butterflies have never tasted it. To these should be added their luxurious spread of wings, giving opportunities for those likenesses and variations of color which protect them during the few days of their winged state; the brief time when, if ever, their eggs must be laid and the continuance of the race made sure. The whole realm of animal "mimicry," as it is now termed, reaches its highest point in them and leads to some extreme cases, as in the fact that, while butterflies are ordinarily monogamous, there is yet one species in Africa which has departed so widely from this rule that the male has not one mate only, but actually three different wives, each so utterly unlike him in appearance as to have long been taken for wholly different species.—T. W. Higginson in Atlantic.


Not at Home.
