

ATTENDANCE IS LIGHT

Institute Enrollment But One Hundred Sixty-One.

WORK NOW IN FULL SWING

Superintendent Huffman is Well Pleased, However, and Believes Institute Will be a Success.

It is a regulation normal week, hotter than all get out, and with the pretty, white-gowned school ma'ams as the only relieving feature. There are not so many of them as usual, however, the enrollment being only one hundred and sixty-one when reported this morning. Supt. Huffman is not discouraged, however, but lays the decreased attendance to the high standard imposed upon teachers by recent legislation. The corps of instructors is a good one and the work of the institute is now in full swing.

Supt. Hoffman further explains the light attendance by saying that many teachers living in other counties and teaching in Crawford, are saved expense by being enrolled here and given credit for work done in their home county institute. Thus the present enrollment is one hundred and ninety, and will probably reach two hundred by tomorrow night.

Supt. Hoffman is conducting the institute in person, assisted by Prof. W. C. Van Ness, County Superintendent Barlow, of Carroll; Superintendent Beveridge, of Missouri Valley; Superintendent Mitchell, of Charter Oak; Prof. Cameron, of the Cedar Rapids High School, who is giving interesting lectures on the elements of agriculture, and Miss Bertha Cadwell, of Ft. Dodge. President Palmer of the Cedar Rapids Business College, will be here Monday and Tuesday for two days' special instruction in penmanship.

Supt. Hoffman announces the following lectures at the college chapel:

Tonight—Prof. Cameron, illustrated lecture on "Birds."

Friday night—Prof. Cameron, illustrated lecture on "Yellowstone Park."

On Thursday of next week Prof. Shelton of Simpson College will deliver three lectures, one in the morning, one just before the noon hour and one at night.

On Thursday evening will also occur the graduation from the Rural Schools of the county of a class of about twelve, who have completed the eight years' course and whose diplomas will admit them to any high school in the county.

MORE FAMILY GRIEF.

Marriage A Failure After Twenty-Two Years.

JOHN HALL SUES FOR DIVORCE

Petition States That Wife has Assaulted Him With Knives, Clubs and Neck-yoke. Townships Sensation

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That the defendant in violation of her marriage vows, on divers dates and occasions within the last eight years, without any fault of plaintiff, willfully has threatened his life and has frequently assaulted him with knives and clubs and but recently, within the last week, with a neckyoke and with other dangerous weapons, and did beat, bruise and pound the plaintiff and that by reason of such assaults and threats and poundings, has endangered the life of the plaintiff, and his life is in danger by reason of such conduct on the part of defendant. Plaintiff further asks a temporary injunction to restrain defendant from violence and to compel her to allow him to work on his farm.

Injunction as prayed was granted by Judge F. M. Powers on August 2nd.

Mr. and Mrs. Hall were married in Dundee, Ill. in 1883. They have two children, one married and one living at home. We understand Mrs. Hall has left the farm and that Mr. Hall is in peaceful possession of the premises. We are further told that the officers had a sensational time when serving the injunction papers. Mrs. Hall misunderstanding the nature of their errand. Again let us say that this affair is greatly regretted. We believe the hot weather has something to do with the frequency and violence of temper and for the sake of the tranquility of the county we would urge all to keep as cool as possible and to keep their temper in check. From Paradise township come another tale of domestic grief and we can but think that the hot weather has something to do with the epidemic of conjugal infelicity. Keep cool.
