The Greater World's Fair.

A great international exhibition is planned for Los Angeles in 1915. The Universal Peace and Commerce Exposition company was organized in the committee room of the Chamber of Commerce at Los Angeles the other night, with a capitalization of \$25,000. Before plans have advanced to completion the capitalization may be increased to \$100,000,000, says a Los Angeles dispatch. It is planned to hold in Los Angeles the largest international exposition ever attempted in the history of the world, eclipsing both the Chicago and St. Louis expositions and exceeding in magnitude any effort of the kind on either hemisphere. Henry E. Huntington was chosen president and former Minister Conger a director.
