Side Lights on Next Sunday's Lesson for Teachers and Pupils.

June 2—Review of the Quarter's Lessons.

The lessons of this quarter began with the vision of Jacob, when God told him that He would be with him and bless him, of course conditioned upon the faithfulness of Jacob to God's commands. The second lesson tells of the struggle of Jacob with the angel and the bestowal of his new name of "Israel" which means to prevail or overcome. While many have much fault to find with the life of Jacob yet he is a type of many a man and woman of today. He had deep in his nature the desire to serve God but, stronger than that in his early career, was human ambition, cunning, a desire to over reach, dependence on self, rather than God. There came a time, when he became aware of the supernatural by personal experience, he saw his helplessness, viewed his crooked career and, surrendered his life. This did not allow him to escape the consequence of his early wrong doings, for he was weighted with sorrows, but through it all he now had the consciousness of supreme trust in God. Jacob had what our holiness friends would call a "second birth" and this is a condition which very many should pray for.

Greater men than Jacob have been brought to attention in the last quarter. One of these was Joseph, the one man of the old testament on whose record there is no blemish. The towering strength of his character lay in his devotion and faithfulness to the one true God, and his magnificent generosity in forgiving his bretheren for wrongs they did him. Those familiar with the history of Joseph know that he was tempted and urged to commit a great sin, to be unfaithful to his master, Potiphar. The way he met this, is the thing we desire to emphasize. He said in substance "How can I commit a breach of trust to my master, for he has put everything in my charge and kept nothing back from me but his own wife?" In view of the trust put in me "How then can I do this great wickedness and sin against God?" How many men today could afford to have constantly before them these sentiments of Joseph. He said I have been trusted and I will not fail to do right. We give a man credit if the base motive of danger of imprisonment restrains him from crime, we think the more of him if consideration for his mother, father wife, and children controls him, but what words of proper commendation are worthy to express the praise due to one who holds back saying "I cannot do this sin against God". This should be the stand of every one tempted to do wrong. Then consider his forgiveness of his brothers who had it in their hearts to kill him, but did sel him as a slave, who lied to his father as to his failure to come home with them and who through, many years saw their father Jacob crushed down with sorrow over the loss of his boy, and the ten of them kept back the truth from the old man, for at least twenty years. Joseph saw that all his suffering and that of his father had worked out for good, and so he forgave, but the guilt of the brothers was as deep as if things had turned out wrong.

We must briefly speak of Moses for the notes are stretching out now too long. He was the greatest of all, some say the greatest man of all history. The laws set forth by him in his remote times show wisdom of tremendous depth, and have not been improved upon in all the centuries since. We draw but the one lesson now from his career, and it is this that he chose to become a lowly, despised Jew and thus acknowledged himself a believer in the one God, rather than to be a powerful Egyptian prince enjoying outward satisfaction for the time being but forfeiting, as it would have turned out, immortality both in spirit and in standing before the world for all time to come. The lesson comes to us to stand for God and endure hardness rather than seek ease and luxury at the expense of doing wrong.
