## Sunday School Column

Side Lights on Next Sunday's Lesson for Teachers and Pupils.

August 18th The Day of Atonement, Lev. 16, 5-22.

While on its face a recital of what the priests should do in the religious worship of the Jews, thousands of years ago, this lesson is important for proper understanding of God's plan of redemption as set forth in the holy bible. It will be remembered that in the division of space in the Tabernacle that one portion was set off by heavy curtains and was designated "The Holy of Holies" as also that into this sacred enclosure none but the High Priest could go, and then but once a year. The lesson of this Sunday tells about his annual visit to the very holy place, what he should do, and what his doing signified.

The great day was called "The day of the Atonement". It was on this day that the High Priest offered sacrifices for his own sins and those of all the people. He was to take off his usual robes of office, and to be simply clad in pure white linen after having washed himself perfectly clean. He was to sacrifice a young bullock firstly for his own sins, and to sprinkle the blood before the mercy seat of the most holy place. He was to take two goats without blemish, the one he was to sacrifice for the sins of the people, and the other was to be led from the camp and let go after the priest had put his hands on him, and laid on his head the sins and transgressions of the people. The last named animal was made the "scape goat" for the wrong doing of others.

The strength of this lesson comes through noting how the innocent Jesus in time became the sacrifice for the sins of the people. He, like the scape goat, was taken out of the gate bearing the sins of the world. Lastly Jesus became the high priest entering into the Holy of Holies in heaven and there ever liveth to make intercession for us. The masterful Paul in Hebrews takes up this matter and deals with it in a convincing way.

In the fourth chapter and fourteenth verse Paul says: "Seeing then that we have a great high priest, that is passed into the heavens, Jesus the son of God, let us hold fast our profession." In Hebrews seven and twenty-fifth and twenty-sixth verses Paul says: "For such a high priest became us, who is holy, harmless, undefiled, separate from sinners and made higher than the heavens" Wherefore he is able to save them to the uttermost that come unto God by Him, seeing He ever liveth to make intercession for them. "Again Paul writes in the eighth chapter and the eleventh and following verses, "neither by the blood of goats and calves, but by His blood." "He entered in once into the holy place, having obtained eternal redemption for us." If the blood of bulls and goats sanctifieth to the purifying of the flesh how much more shall the blood of Christ who through the eternal Spirit offered without spot to God, judge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?"

After reading of these verses little need be added. It is indeed a blessed thought that we all have this mediator who ever liveth to make intercession for us, and that the sacrifice made by Jesus on to the cross "one for all" made an atonement for us.

### TO PRESERVE WALL LAKE.

Correspondent in Story City Herald Calls Attention to Possibilities of Nearby Lake.

A correspondent in the Story City Herald last week made an appeal for the preservation, improvement and beautifying Wall Lake, and its permanent use as a pretty and enjoyable pleasure resort for the people of surrounding towns and vicinities.

The Herald's correspondent' article is as follows:

"Say fellows, let's not allow any nasty old dredging outfit to root its way through our dear old lake and steal it away from us. Let's—now all together—ask Uncle Sam to keep it for us that we may fit it up, trim its face and fringe it roundabout with beautiful trees and fine walks. Why sigh for boat trips over in Europe or somewhere else way off when we can launch our little boats close to our own thresholds, with additional privilege of not having to spend anything on railroad fare, steamer berths, trips, etc. in order to get there.

We are always apt to think that the Elysian fields are situated afar off, way over on the other side of the globe, overlooking meanwhile the Eldorado that lies within a stone's throw of us.

We are living in the garden spot of the world to be sure, (so say the knowing ones) but is there no possible room for improvement any more? How about this lake?

A farmer who has lived near the lake for over thirty years and having observed matters, is quoted as saying that if the muskrats were not bothered they alone would clear the lake of weeds and rushes in a comparatively short time. There is sufficient depth for launches and small sail boats.

At present fish are quite plentiful, enough at least to provide pastime for the hook and line fraternity.

It is not likely that the natural springs that feed the lake will run dry soon.

It would surprise us all what one competent man could accomplish towards beautifying the lake and its shores if he were given fitting remuneration enabling him to spend his active time there.

No doubt but that a large amount of volunteer work would be proffered from all over this vast community to push this grand undertaking to as rapid a completion as possible.

The average expense per persona if such and everybody took part would be innumerable indeed!

Hark ye, Jewell, Storm City, Randall, Ellsworth, and respective communities, also other neighboring towns and vicinities, come one, come all, to the great mass meeting which ought to be held about September 1st this year at some centrally located place for the purpose of preserving Wall Lake for ourselves and for future generations.—"Friend of Wall Lake."

### PROPOSAL FOR CONSTRUCTION OF SANITARY SEWER.

To whom it may concern: The City Council of the city of Denison, Iowa, will receive bids for the construction of a line of sanitary sewer, commencing on Pine street at the end of the sewer at a point one hundred and eighty feet north of a manhole at the intersection of Church street and Pine street and running thence along Pine street a distance of five hundred and ninety feet to a point at the intersection of Burt street and Pine street, then west four hundred feet to the intersection of Park street and Burt street. Also commencing at the intersection of Burt street and Pine street a running northeasterly and east a distance of four hundred and thirty seven feet, along east Prospect street to the intersection of High street and east Prospect street, comprising in all 1415 feet, including not to exceed 50 "Y" joints and four manholes. Said sewer to be constructed of eight inch vitrified pipe and laid in accordance with specification now on file in the office of the city engineer. All bids to be accompanied with a sample "joint" of the pipe upon which the bid is made.

The said work shall be completed not later than the first day of November A. D. 1907. The said work to be paid for when completed and accepted by the City Council, and the successful bidder agrees to accept Sewer Certificates in payment of said work. The Council will meet on the 19th day of August, A. D. 1907 for the purpose of opening said proposals. All bids must be filed in the office of the City Clerk not later than 7 o'clock on the 19th, day of August, A. D. 1907. All bids must be in separate envelopes marked "Proposals" and shall be ac-

companied by a certificate check of 10 per cent of the amount of the bid, payable to the city treasurer as security of said sewer. Also that said Contractor shall give such bond as is prescribed by the City Council for the faithful performance of said contract; also shall be conditioned that the contractor shall keep said sewer in repair for one year from date of its acceptance by the City. In case the successful bidder shall fail to enter into contract or to furnish bond as required by law, said check shall be forfeited to the City of Denison, Iowa, as agreed and litigated damages. The right is reserved to reject any or all bids.
