The farmers have each listed a portion of their lands with the Association for the purpose of bringing in more farmers to raise beets. These lands are all under irrigation and are offered in 40, 80 or 100 acre tracts at \$20.00 to \$35.00 per acre.

Sugar Beets will produce from 15 to 20 tons per acre, the factory price is \$5.00 per ton delivered at factory or at any side track on the railroad. All hand labor will be secured by the factory. Only a limited quantity of land to be had. No land will be sold to speculators at any price and not more than 100 acres to any one farmer.

It was moved by Rollins and seconded by Jones, that the following resolution be passed.

Be it resolved by the city council of Denison, Iowa, having met for the purpose of considering and hearing all objections for the sewer commencing at the intersection of Washington Avenue and East Prospect Street and running south on Washington Avenue to a point directly opposite the alley running east and west through blocks 138 and 139 to connect with the sewer owned by the Independent School District of Denison, Iowa, on Washington Avenue. And no objections having been made the schedule as on file in the office of the city clerk is hereby approved and levy made and certificates be issued as provided by law. On roll call vote resulted as follows: Jones yes, Wright yes, Lane yes, Tucker yes, Motion carried.

It was moved by Rollins and seconded by Jones, that M. D. Wright and E. F. Tucker be elected delegates to attend the annual Convention of the League of Municipalities to be held at Council Bluffs, Iowa, Sept. 17th, 18th and 19th, 1907. Motion carried, all members present voting yes.

It was moved by Rollins and seconded by Lane that the following resolution be passed. Be it resolved by the City of Denison, Iowa, that the notice to property owners adjoining and abutting on the streets where said sewer was laid, beginning at the intersection of Washington Avenue and East Prospect street and running south on Washington Avenue to a point directly opposite the alley running east and west through blocks 138 and 139 to connect with the sewer owned by the Independent School District of Denison, Iowa. Be ordered published and copy of same be mailed to each property owner that assessment will become due the first day of March 1908, unless waiver is signed as provided on sewer certificates. And upon roll call vote was as follows: Jones yes, Wright yes, Rollins yes, Lane yes, Tucker yes. Motion carried.

On motion council adjourned to meet September 4th, 1907, at 10 o'clock a. m.
