It was moved by Rollins and seconded by Tucker that the Mayor and City Clerk be hereby instructed to execute and deliver to A. J. Gary, assessment certificates to the amount of \$1532.00 in payment for construction of sewer on Anthony, Walnut and Dyer streets and Railroad Avenue with interest at 6 per cent from July 26th, 1907. On roll call vote resulted as follows: Jones no, Wright no, Rollins yes, Lane yes, Tucker yes. Motion lost.

It was moved by Rollins and seconded by Jones, that a committee be appointed by the Mayor, to employ attorneys to look after advice as to sewer certificates and other cases now pending against the City of Denison, Iowa. Council Proceedings Sept. 28th, 1907.


Council met in adjourned session at 8 o'clock p. m.

Be it resolved by the City Council of the city of Denison, Iowa, that street improvements be ordered by the laying and construction of a sanitary sewer of eight inch vitrified sewer pipe and the construction of three manholes and not less than twenty 'Y' joints on the following streets to wit: Commencing at the manhole at the intersection

of Walnut and Anthony streets and running thence west on Walnut street to the intersection of Walnut and Howard streets, thence north on Howard street to the intersection of Howard and Chestnut streets, said sewer to be constructed according to plat and specifications now on file at the office of the city clerk of Denison, Iowa.

Proposals of the Construction of a Sanitary Sewer in Denison, Iowa.

To Whom It May Concern: The city council of the city of Denison, Iowa, will receive bids for the construction of a line of sanitary sewer, commencing at the point of intersection of Chestnut and Howard streets, thence extending south one block to the intersection of Howard and Walnut streets thence east two blocks to the intersection of Walnut and Anthony streets to connect with a public sanitary sewer at that point, comprising in all not to exceed 1190 feet including not to exceed 20 "Y" joints and 3 manholes. Said sewer to be constructed of eight-inch vitrified sewer pipe and laid in accordance with specifications now on file at the office of the city Clerk of Denison, Iowa. All bids to be accompanied with a sample joint of the pipe upon which the bid is made. The said work shall be completed no later than the first day of December, 1907, the said work to be paid for when completed and accepted by the City Council, and the successful bidder agrees to accept Sewer Certificate, to be issued as soon as practicable in full payment of said work. The city Council will meet on the 18th day of October, 1907, for the purpose of opening said proposals. All bids must be filed in the office of the City Clerk not later than 7 o'clock P. M. on the 18th day of Oct. 1907. All bids must be in a separate envelope marked "Proposals" and shall be accompanied by a certified check of at least 10 per cent of the amount of the bid, payable to the City Treasurer as security that the successful bidder will enter into a contract for the construction of said sewer. Also the said contractor shall give bonds as is prescribed by the City Council for the faithful performance of the contract; also shall be conditioned that the contractor shall keep said sewer in repair for one year from the date of acceptance by the City. In case the successful bidder shall fail to enter into contract to furnish bond as required by law, said check shall be forfeited to the City of Denison, Iowa, as agreed and liquidated damages. The right is reserved to reject any and all bids.
