Jan. 19—Jesus and His First Disciples. John 1:43-51.

The lesson verses for to-day follow immediately after those of last Sunday. John had given the statement to his disciples, and the public, that the carpenter's son of Nazareth was the Lamb of God.

Of the many lessons to be gathered from this scripture we call attention to three: First: The replies of Jesus and Phillip "Come and see" Christian people but ask from a seeker after Jesus that he read what He said, and consider the results which have come in the world.

Second: When Andrew and Phillip found Jesus they made haste to call Simon Peter, and Nathanael. These men set an example for all disciples and believers of Jesus, they energized themselves to bring others to Him.

Third: Jesus knew of the history of Peter, and the character of Nathanael by His supernatural wisdom. He knows us likewise, and to conceal from Him is useless.

There have been liberal receipts of cattle at all points this week. The run has been especially liberal here. On Monday the market opened slow and 10 to 15 cents lower on killing cattle.

The hog trade today is a nickel lower. Receipts are liberal but the demand is good at prevailing prices. Bulk sold at \$4.15 to \$4.20; top \$4.25. Heavy supplies at all markets have had a rather depressing influence on the trade.
