There has become effective a new postal regulation between America and the British Isles, by the terms of which ordinary first class letter mail will pass back and forth between the countries at the rate of two cents, just the same as letters sent wholly within our own country. This ruling applies to England, Scotland, Ireland and Wales. It is the most liberal international postage rate that has been established in the history of the world.
