What You Can Shoot.

Here is the Iowa game law for this fall and winter. Read it carefully before you pull the trigger.

It is unlawful to use swivel gun or to use any trap, snare or device in hunting game birds.

Unlawful to kill deer, elk or mountain goat at any time or to kill quail in public highway.

Unlawful to shoot game between sunset and sunrise or to destroy the nests of any song or game bird.

Unlawful to use dynamite or other explosives in catching fish or to catch game fish with other than fish line and hook.

Unlawful to sell game birds of any kind.

Duck, Goose, Brant, Rail, Plover, Sand Piper, Marsh or Beach Birds, September 1st to April 1st.

Quail, Ruffed Grouse or pheasant, Wild Turkey, November 1st to December 15th.

Woodcock, July 10th to January 1st.

Dinnated Grouse, Prairie Chicken, September 1st to December 1st.

Gray or Fox Squirrel, September 1st to January 1st.

Black, white or Striped Bass, Pike, Pickerel, Crayfish, not less than 15 inches long, and Catfish not less than 10 inches long, June 1st to March 31st.

Licenses—To residents \$1.00, non-residents \$10.00 per annum. Hunters must carry licenses in field.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

Board met at one o'clock p. m.

Resolved by the Board of Supervisors of Crawford county, That, Whereas heretofore and on or about the 26th day of August 1909, a petition in writing was filed with the County Auditor of Crawford county, Iowa, representing: that a large tract of land lying along the Boyer river and including in width about two miles on either side of said river is subject to overflow and too wet for cultivation, and that the public benefit and utility will be promoted by ditching, leveeing the same and changing the natural course of the Boyer river, asking therein that a survey of said lands be made by an engineer appointed by said board of Supervisors of said county to survey and report thereon, and that said survey begin at section one in Union Township, running southwest through said Union Township, Crawford county, Iowa, along the Boyer river valley and terminating at the south line of section 34 in Boyer Township Crawford County, to connect with the Harrison county ditch and whereas, it appearing from said petition that the same is signed by twenty-eight property owners whose lands will be benefited by said proposed ditch, and that they constitute a majority of the property owners living along said proposed ditch and that a good and sufficient bond has been filed conditioned as provided by law with the county auditor, and whereas it appears to the Board of Supervisors that the prayer of said petition ought to be granted

Therefore be it resolved that the prayer of said petition be granted and that Morris McHenry be appointed the Engineer to make said survey and report thereon his findings to the Board of Supervisors at their November meeting to be held November 8, 1909.
