**Death of a Pioneer.**

West Side Journal: In the death of Ellert Auen, Sr., at Carnarvon, Iowa, Carroll county loses one of its earliest settlers. Mr. Auen had been ailing for several months from a complication of diseases, dying at his home in Carnarvon Friday evening, Sept. 24th, surrounded by his immediate family. Ellert Auen was born in Freesland, Germany, May 5th, 1835, and spent his early manhood as a sailor. In 1868 he came to America, settling near Ackley, in Butler county, where he remained for five years when he again moved farther west, locating on a farm in Wheatland township, Carroll county, where he lived until his retirement to Arcadia in 1896. A couple of years ago his sons started in business in Carnarvon and Mr. Auen moved his family there. Ellert Auen was a most entertaining companion and always had a lot of funny and interesting stories to talk of which endeared him to all of his acquaintances. He leaves with his aged wife to mourn his loss four sons, Henry, John, Ellert, Jr., and George, three daughters, Mrs. Greves of Ashton, Iowa, Mrs. H. F. Garrells of Lake View, Iowa, and Mrs. A. A. Kelly of Arcadia, besides one brother, Henry of Carnarvon. The funeral from Carnarvon on Monday was largely attended, the remains being laid to rest in the Presbyterian cemetery in Wheatland township, the congregation of which Mr. Auen was a staunch supporter.

**Sunday School Column**

Side Lights on Next Sunday's Lesson for Teachers and Pupils.

Oct. 10. Paul a Prisoner—The Plot. Acts 22:30; 23:35.

The most interesting account of the life history of Paul is continued in the lesson for today. It will be remembered that he was a prisoner in the castle under Roman guard. In the eye of the Roman law he had done nothing worthy for being held. To satisfy the Jews and to develop something against Paul, the officer in charge took Paul before the Jewish council for examination. It gave him also a chance to make further defense. Paul started out to explain his life work, when contrary to law and justice one of the council ordered him to be smitten in the mouth. Paul knew his rights and came back with a reply holding up to scorn one who pretended to judge according to law and openly violated it. His attention was called to the admonition that one should not speak evil of those in authority and thereupon he apologized, saying he spoke without considering that the man giving the unlawful order, was the high priest. Realizing that before this council he would not have justice Paul made a shrewd move in declaring himself a believer in the resurrection of the body after death. Those of his listeners who were Pharisees and who argued that the scriptures gave promise of life after death, a resurrection, spirit and angels, said they found no fault in Paul, while the Sadducees who denied these things, were sure he was bad and should be punished. There arose such a dispute that the Roman officer again interfered and bore Paul to a safe place.

The foes of Paul were again baffled, but did not give up. They stirred up a band to make a vow that they would eat or drink nothing until they had killed Paul. They decided to ask that he again be taken before the council and while he was going or coming they would kill him. This wicked plan came to naught, for it was overheard by a lad, a relative of Paul who made it known to the Roman captain and he summoned a band of his men and by night took his prisoner to Caesarea. The account of the soldier taking the boy by the hand and asking for his story is a beautiful one.

There are a host of lessons to be drawn from the chapter under consideration, and of these we call attention to the following: 1st. Paul was ready to bear witness to Jesus under all circumstances, even though his hearers were the chief men of the Jewish church. 2nd. We see how far hatred will make men go, when they will disobey law, to injure one whom they dislike. 3d. After the meeting at the council Paul had a direct vision from the Lord telling him that he should be of good cheer and that he should yet tell of Jesus at Rome, thus showing divine care of this faithful disciple. 4th. The evil plans of the murderous band were foiled. 5th. The activity of the boy and the consideration of the captain who took him by the hand and alone for the talk. 6th. The young people can do something in God's cause as well as the older ones.
