UNION STOCK YARDS.

Receipts this week with comparison.

CATTLE.

Receipts of cattle this week have been very satisfactory, the total being right close to the record made last week and a year ago. At the same time there has been some improvement in the quality of the receipts. In spite of liberal offerings the market has gradually advanced under free buying, resulting from large orders in hands of both local buyers and shippers. The trade has been active as prices have worked upward and at the close of the week the market is in a good healthy condition with prices on all kinds of killing cattle 25c higher than one week ago. Veal calves, however, were very high last week and they have shown no material advance. Feeding cattle are 15 to 25c higher and the trade has been very active all the week. It might be added that prices this week have been the highest of the year to date, the best beef steers reaching \$7.50 with a few choice cows at \$7.25 and with western feeders up to \$6.60.

HOGS.

While receipts of hogs this week have held up very well as compared with last week there has been a shortage as compared with a year ago of over 31,000 head. The market has rapidly advanced new high records being made pretty nearly every day. The advance has been even sensational during the last few days. Today hogs sold largely at \$10.35 to \$10.45, with a top at \$10.55. This makes the advance for the week about 70c on an average. A noteworthy feature of the market is the fact that good light hogs are selling pretty well upward toward the top but trashy light hogs are still bringing bottom figures.

SHEEP.

Receipts of sheep have been disappointingly small this week, showing a considerable falling off as compared with last week and a decrease of over 12,000 head as compared with a year ago. This was to be expected however, as all reports have indicated rapidly diminishing supplies in the country. A splendid buying demand in the face of light receipts had the natural result of advancing prices and at the close of the week lambs are fully 15c higher, while sheep are 15 to 25c higher. New record prices have been made during the week, the best lambs having sold up to \$9.50,

with yearlings at \$8.75, wethers at \$7.95 and ewes at \$7.70. All in all it has been a most satisfactory market from a seller's standpoint.
