STATE OFFICIAL HERE.

Mr. Higgins of State Board of Health Recommends That City Protect Water by Sewering.

The city council has been contemplating building a sewer system in East Denison in the vicinity of Washington park, in order that the city wells may be better protected. There has been considerable opposition to this sewer, resulting in the state board of health sending one of its members to Denison to look over the situation, and on the 28th Mr. Higgins came from Des Moines and went over the ground, and in the evening conferred with the city council. In his talk to the council Mr. Higgins pointed out the extreme importance of protecting the city water from pollution and cited that the surface water from the up town districts should be carried away and not allowed to accumulate on the low ground near the city wells. Mr. Higgins also stated that the city council should take immediate steps to either sewer that portion of the city in the vicinity of the wells or to compel the property owners to build water tight and sanitary closets.

He called particular attention to the fact that all closets should be made fly proof and the vaults built of cement. One case of typhoid resulting in death would mean much more than any expense that might be made in protecting city water. No action, however, will be taken in the sewer matter until June 7th, at which time the meeting was adjourned to.
