WASHINGTON, July 11.—(Special correspondence)—Democratic leaders in congress find little consolation in a review of election figures in the so-called "doubtful" states.

The attempt of the present administration to muzzle the periodical press of the country by placing in the hands of the postmaster general power to put almost any magazine out of business by sending it by freight, has been given its quietus in the senate.
