The Cake Box.

CHOCOLATE CAKE.—Beat the yolk of an egg, add half a cupful of milk, a cupful of sugar and a cupful of grated chocolate, cook over boiling water until it thickens, then set aside until cold.

Walnut Cream For Filling.—A cupful and a half of milk, scalded, an egg well beaten, a scant half cupful of sugar, a dessertspoonful each of flour and cornstarch, a quarter teaspoonful of salt, mix all with egg, add to milk and cook in double boiler until quite thick.

Raisin Cake.—This is fine and keeps good in hot weather as well as cold. Take an egg, beat thoroughly, add a tablespoonful of lard, a tablespoonful of butter and three-quarters of a cupful of sugar.

Nut Cake.—Cream three-quarters of a cupful of butter with a cupful of sugar and add two well beaten eggs and a cupful of milk.
