**IOWA LEAGUE OF WOMEN VOTERS**  
Des Moines, Jan. 28, 1920.

For the first time in history, Iowa women will help this year to elect the head of our national government. Possibly they will also help to elect our own state officials.

And so, whether she wanted the franchise or not, every Iowa woman must awaken to the fact that the vote is not only a privilege but a duty, and that in the coming elections she must face great responsibilities, the outcome of which not only will affect the welfare of the state and nation, but also that of her own home and family.

In order to help the women of the state to study the present political situation intelligently and practically, the extension division of the State University of Iowa, in cooperation with the Iowa League of Women Voters, will conduct a school of citizenship in Iowa City, February 18th, 19th and 20th. The school will not attempt to dictate party politics, it will be purely educational, leading to its pupils the choice of party, after they have been instructed in our system of government and the big issues at hand. Courses will be conducted by the faculty members of the university, and will include lectures on the constitutions of the United States and of Iowa; municipal government; schools; state boards and commissions; the machinery and significance of political parties; primary elections, and machinery of elections. Practical demonstrations of voting will be given and all courses will be conducted in such a practical manner as to give a good working knowledge to the women who are to cast their vote for the first time in a great election.

The importance of such a school of citizenship cannot be too strongly emphasized. Every woman who expects to take an active part in politics, and every woman who expects to assist other women in a study of civil government, should make a point of attending.
